4. Title: Historical African American cemeteries; City of Chesapeake.

5. Summary: This bill adds one cemetery in Chesapeake to the list of cemeteries for which qualified organizations may receive funds from the Department of Historic Resources for the care of historical African American cemeteries and graves. The cemetery is Cuffeytown Cemetery, containing 105 eligible graves.

8. Fiscal Implications: This bill specifically lists the Cuffeytown Cemetery, with a total of 105 eligible graves. Based on the number of graves and the \$5.00 minimal payment for each, the estimated fiscal impact to the general fund would be at least \$525 per year. The fiscal impact of providing funding equal to the average actual cost of routine maintenance is indeterminate.

Budget language in paragraph I.1 of Item 385 in HB30/SB30, as introduced, provides \$100,000 in FY 2021 and \$150,000 in FY 2022 from the general fund to support the preservation and care of historical African American graves. Out of these amounts, \$54,655 in each year is for the care and maintenance of graves and cemeteries listed in the Code and in Item 385, paragraphs I.2. through I.10., and \$45,345 is available in FY 2021 and \$95,345 is available in FY 2022 to support the care and maintenance of historical African American cemeteries and graves in addition to those that are specifically listed in statute and the budget

bill. It is anticipated that this funding is sufficient to support the care and maintenance of the 105 eligible graves in this bill at the \$5.00 minimal payment for each.

However, to add the graves and cemeteries provided for in this bill and the funding for their care and maintenance to those specifically listed in the budget in paragraphs I.2. through I.10., a language amendment to Item 385 of HB30/SB, as introduced, would be required.
