4. Title: Permits the Chesterfield County School Board to establish a recovery high school

5. Summary: Permits the Chesterfield County School Board, with such funds as may be appropriated for such purpose pursuant to the general appropriation act, to establish a year-round recovery high school in the school division as a year-round high school (i) for which enrollments open to any high school student who resides in Superintendent's Region 1 and is in the early stages of recovery from substance use disorder or dependency and (ii) for the purpose of providing such students with the academic, emotional, and social support necessary to make progress toward earning a high school diploma and reintegrating into a traditional high school setting.

8. Fiscal Implications: The legislation requires an appropriation in the general appropriation act to establish a recovery high school in Superintendent's Region 1 in Chesterfield County. The additional state costs cannot be determined, as any cost is dependent on the amount of funding appropriated by the General Assembly to the recovery high school.
