3. Committee: Public Safety

4. Title: Strip searches of children.

5. Summary: The bill prohibits strip search of a child under the age of 14, of a child who is 14 years of age or older but under 18 years of age unless the child and such child's parent, guardian, or other person responsible for the care of such child has authorized or consented to the strip search.

Additionally, it provides that no person can be denied noncontact visitation on the basis of withholding authorization or consent.

The bill provides exemptions for juveniles committed to the Department of Juvenile Justice or detained in a secure local facility.

8. Fiscal Implications: According to the Department of Corrections, this bill is not expected to have a fiscal impact on agency operations. The bill is not expected to have a fiscal impact on the Department of Juvenile Justice. The fiscal impact on local secure facilities cannot be determined at this time.
