**3. Committee:** Passed both houses.

**4. Title:** Prohibition on possession of stun weapon on school property; exemption.

**5. Summary:** Permits the possession of a stun weapon that is in a closed container in or upon a motor vehicle that is on school property. The bill also permits persons who have a valid concealed handgun permit to possess a stun weapon while in a motor vehicle in a parking lot, traffic circle, or other means of vehicular ingress or egress to a school.

**8. Fiscal Implications:** This bill adds to the list of exemptions for weapons permitted on school property to include a stun weapon that is in a closed container in or upon a motor vehicle, or any stun weapon in a motor vehicle in a parking lot, traffic circle, or other means of vehicular ingress or egress to a school that is in the possession of a person who possesses a valid concealed handgun permit.

There is no anticipated fiscal impact on any state agency as a result of the provisions of this proposed legislation.
