3. Committee: Floor Substitute

4. Title: Project labor agreements; public procurement.

5. Summary: Extends current requirements that state agencies ensure that neither the state agency nor any construction manager acting on its behalf (i) requires or prohibits bidders, offerors, contractors, or subcontractors to enter into or adhere to project labor agreements with labor organizations or (ii) discriminates against bidders, offerors, contractors, subcontractors, or operators for becoming or refusing to sign or adhere to project labor agreements on the same or other related public works projects to apply to public bodies.

6. Budget Amendment Necessary: No.

7. Fiscal Impact Estimates: No state fiscal impact.

8. Fiscal Implications: The requirements in this bill already apply to state agencies, including any authority, board, department, instrumentality, institution, agency, or other unit of state government. This bill extends these requirements to other public bodies. As such, no state fiscal impact is anticipated.

9. Specific Agency or Political Subdivisions Affected: All public bodies.

10. Technical Amendment Necessary: Yes. Line 15, the term “public body” is stricken, but the remaining definition on lines 15 through 17 remain. It is unclear whether the intent of this bill is to provide a new definition for “public body” or use the existing definition under the Virginia Public Procurement Act. For the purposes of this impact statement, the definition of “public body” provided in the bill is assumed to be the intended definition.
