**2. Patron:** Marsden

**3. Committee:** Education and Health

**4. Title:** In-state tuition; domicile; individuals granted Deferred Action for Childhood Arrivals.

**5. Summary:** Declares that, absent congressional intent to the contrary, any individual currently granted Deferred Action for Childhood Arrivals by U.S. Citizenship and Immigration Services has the capacity to intend to remain in the Commonwealth indefinitely and is therefore eligible to establish domicile and receive in-state tuition charges at any public institution of higher education in the Commonwealth.

**7. Fiscal Impact Estimates:** Preliminary. See Item 8.

**8. Fiscal Implications:** This bill could allow for certain students to become eligible for in-state tuition who currently pay the out-of-state rate, and would constitute a loss of revenue equal to the difference between the two for institutions where such students are enrolled. The number of students who would be affected and the associated lost revenue are indeterminate.

**9. Specific Agency or Political Subdivisions Affected:** Public institutions of higher education.
