**2. Patron:** Surovell

**3. Committee:** Education and Health

**4. Title:** Conversion therapy, prohibited by certain health care providers.

**5. Summary:** Prohibits any health care provider or person who performs counseling as part of his training for any profession licensed by a regulatory board of the Department of Health Professions from engaging in conversion therapy, as defined in the bill, with any person under 18 years of age and provides that such counseling constitutes unprofessional conduct and is grounds for disciplinary action. The bill provides that no state funds shall be expended for the purpose of conducting conversion therapy, referring a person for conversion therapy, extending health benefits coverage for conversion therapy, or awarding a grant or contract to any entity that conducts conversion therapy or refers individuals for conversion therapy.

**8. Fiscal Implications:** This bill, as amended, would not have a fiscal impact on the Commonwealth. The Department of Health Professions' health regulatory boards have already adopted guidance and have initiated rulemaking consistent with provisions of the bill.
