**4. Title:** Disorderly conduct in public places; school activities.

**5. Summary:** The bill provides that any student at any elementary or secondary school is not guilty of disorderly conduct if such disorderly conduct occurred on school property, on a school bus, or at any activity conducted or sponsored by any school. Currently, a disorderly conduct in public places is a Class 1 misdemeanor.
