**4. Title:** Compensation for wrongful incarceration; annuity term.

**5. Summary:** Anyone who is convicted of a felony by a county or city circuit court of the Commonwealth and wrongfully incarcerated for such felony may be awarded an annuity as compensation for the wrongful incarceration. Under current law, the annuity period is 25 years for all such persons regardless of life expectancy. This bill provides that the annuity period may be equal to the person's life expectancy if his life expectancy is less than 25 years and the affected person elects this option.
