Summary:** The bill establishes the Virginia Revolutionary 250 Commission to plan, develop, and perform programs and activities to commemorate the 250th anniversary of the American Revolution, the Revolutionary War, and the independence of the United States. The bill has an expiration date of July 1, 2027.
- **6. Budget Amendment Necessary**: Yes, House Bill 30, Item 136 would need an additional \$7,260 per year added to its appropriation.

- **8. Fiscal Implications:** The Senate of Virginia estimates an annual impact of \$2,400 to pay the interim meeting compensation for the 2 Senate members of the Commission. The House of Delegates estimates an annual impact of \$2,400 to pay the interim meeting compensation for the 2 House members. The Secretary of Education estimates the Commission would incur an annual cost of \$7,260 to cover the travel costs and per diems of the 12 nonlegislative citizen members. Gunston Hall estimates staffing and operating expenses for the Commission to be \$250,000 per year for commemoration planning, promotion/marketing, and website development.
