9 10	Be it enacted by the General Assembly of Virginia:
11	1. That § 18.2-186.4 of the Code of Virginia is amended and reenacted as follows:
12	§ 18.2-186.4. Use of a person's identity with the intent to coerce, intimidate, or harass; penalty.
13	It shall be unlawful for any person, with the intent to coerce, intimidate, or harass another person, to
14	publish the person's name or photograph along with identifying information as defined in clauses (iii)
15	through (ix), or clause (xii) of subsection C of § 18.2-186.3, or identification of the person's primary
16	residence address or the primary residence address of the person's family or household member as
17	defined in § 16.1-228. Any person who violates this section is guilty of a Class 1 misdemeanor.
18	Any person who violates this section knowing or having reason to know that person is a
19	law-enforcement officer public official, as defined in § 9.1-101 18.2-186.4:1, is guilty of a Class 6
20	felony. The sentence shall include a mandatory minimum term of confinement of six months.
21	2. That the provisions of this act may result in a net increase in periods of imprisonment or 2000 m^{-1} and 2000 m^{-1
22 23	commitment. Pursuant to § 30-19.1:4 of the Code of Virginia, the estimated amount of the
23 24	necessary appropriation cannot be determined for periods of imprisonment in state adult correctional facilities; therefore, Chapter 1289 of the Acts of Assembly of 2020 requires the
24 25	Virginia Criminal Sentencing Commission to assign a minimum fiscal impact of \$50,000. Pursuant
