B. Every law-enforcement agency and correctional facility shall report to the Department the law-enforcement agency or correctional facility: 1. The name, gender, race, ethnicity, and age of the deceased; 25 2. The date, time, and location of death; of arresting, transported, incarcerated, or otherwise had custody of the deceased; and 28 4.
