3	A BILL to amend and reenact § 22.1-79 of the Code of Virginia, relating to school boards; in-person
4	instruction; Internet access; emergency.

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9	Be it enacted by the General Assembly of Virginia:
10 11	1. That § 22.1-79 of the Code of Virginia is amended and reenacted as follows: § 22.1-79. Powers and duties.
12	A school board shall:
13	1. See that the school laws are properly explained, enforced and observed;
14	2. Secure, by visitation or otherwise, as full information as possible about the conduct of the public
15	schools in the school division and take care that they are conducted according to law and with the
16	utmost efficiency;
17	3. Care for, manage and control the property of the school division and provide for the erecting,
18	furnishing, equipping, and noninstructional operating of necessary school buildings and appurtenances
19 20	and the maintenance thereof by purchase, lease, or other contracts;
20 21	4. Provide for the consolidation of schools or redistricting of school boundaries or adopt pupil assignment plans whenever such procedure will contribute to the efficiency of the school division;
22	5. Insofar as not inconsistent with state statutes and regulations of the Board of Education, operate
23	and maintain the public schools in the school division and determine the length of the school term, the
24	studies to be pursued, the methods of teaching and the government to be employed in the schools;
25	6. In instances in which no grievance procedure has been adopted prior to January 1, 1991, establish
26	and administer by July 1, 1992, a grievance procedure for all school board employees, except the
27	division superintendent and those employees covered under the provisions of Article 2 (§ 22.1-293 et
28 29	seq.) and Article 3 (§ 22.1-306 et seq.) of Chapter 15 of this title, who have completed such probationary period as may be required by the school board, not to exceed 18 months. The grievance
30	procedure shall afford a timely and fair method of the resolution of disputes arising between the school
31	board and such employees regarding dismissal or other disciplinary actions, excluding suspensions, and
32	shall be consistent with the provisions of the Board of Education's procedures for adjusting grievances.
33	Except in the case of dismissal, suspension, or other disciplinary action, the grievance procedure
34	prescribed by the Board of Education pursuant to § 22.1-308 shall apply to all full-time employees of a
35	school board, except supervisory employees;
36 37	7. Perform such other duties as shall be prescribed by the Board of Education or as are imposed by law;
38	8. Obtain public comment through a public hearing not less than 10 days after reasonable notice to
39	the public in a newspaper of general circulation in the school division prior to providing (i) for the
40	consolidation of schools; (ii) the transfer from the public school system of the administration of all
41	instructional services for any public school classroom or all noninstructional services in the school
42	division pursuant to a contract with any private entity or organization; or (iii) in school divisions having
43 14	15,000 pupils or more in average daily membership, for redistricting of school boundaries or adopting
44 45	any pupil assignment plan affecting the assignment of 15 percent or more of the pupils in average daily membership in the affected school. Such public hearing may be held at the same time and place as the
46	meeting of the school board at which the proposed action is taken if the public hearing is held before
47	the action is taken. If a public hearing has been held prior to the effective date of this provision on a
48	proposed consolidation, redistricting or pupil assignment plan which is to be implemented after the
49	effective date of this provision, an additional public hearing shall not be required;
50	9. (Expires July 1, 2025) At least annually, survey the school division to identify critical shortages of
51 52	(i) teachers and administrative personnel by subject matter and (ii) school bus drivers and report such critical shortages to the Superintendent of Public Instruction and to the Virginia Retirement System:

52 critical shortages to the Superintendent of Public Instruction and to the Virginia Retirement System;
53 however, the school board may request the division superintendent to conduct such survey and submit
54 such report to the school board, the Superintendent, and the Virginia Retirement System; and
55 10. Ensure that the public schools within the school division are registered with the Department of

56 State Police to receive from the State Police electronic notice of the registration, reregistration, or
57 verification of registration information of any person required to register with the Sex Offender and
58 Crimes Against Minors Registry pursuant to Chapter 9 (§ 9.1-900 et seq.) of Title 9.1 within that school

- division pursuant to § 9.1-914-; and 59
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- 11. Make available in-person instruction to each enrolled student when any residential area in the local school division is not capable of receiving Internet access at speeds greater than 10 MBps download speed and one MBps upload speed.
