**3. Committee:** Health, Welfare, and Institutions

**4. Title:** Nursing homes, certified nursing facilities, and assisted living facilities; electronic monitoring.

**5. Summary:** Provides for voluntary electronic monitoring of patient's or resident's rooms at nursing homes, certified nursing facilities, and assisted living facilities. The bill requires the Boards of Health and Social Services to adopt regulations governing voluntary electronic monitoring of patient's or resident's rooms and provides that no patient shall be denied admission to or discharged from a nursing home, certified nursing facility, or assisted living facility solely because the patient or resident implements electronic monitoring or refuses to consent to electronic monitoring in any room in which he resides.
