- **4. Title:** Commissioner of Health; publication of information about certain communicable diseases; COVID-19 progress benchmarks; emergency.
- 5. Summary: The Commissioner shall ensure that priority for access to any rapid diagnostic testing indicating the existence of the COVID-19 virus that is already available in the Commonwealth go to essential workers in the Commonwealth. Priority for access to such testing shall include the following groups: (i) health care providers; (ii) law-enforcement officers; (iii) emergency medical services personnel and emergency medical services providers; (iv) firefighters; (v) employees of nursing homes as defined in § 32.1-123 and adult day care centers and assisted living facilities as defined in § 63.2-100; (vi) public and private elementary and secondary schools in the Commonwealth; (vii) public institutions of higher education and private institutions of higher education as defined in § 23.1-100; (viii) private providers licensed by the Department of Behavioral Health and Developmental Services pursuant to Article 2 (§ 37.2-403 et seq.) of Chapter 4 of Title 37.2; and (ix) employees at child day centers, family day homes, and early childhood care and education entities. The bill contains an emergency clause.
