8.	Fiscal Implications: This is an appropriation bill that is separate from HB5005/SB5015, the Governor's introduced budget, establishing a sum sufficient authorization through FY 2022 to expand broadband services. Currently, HB5005/SB5015, as introduced, provides \$49.73 million the first year and \$34.73 million the second year from the general fund for broadband grants, and \$1.16 million in each year from the general fund for administrative support. Depending on the intent of this bill and the pace at which it anticipates expansion of broadband, the Department of Housing and Community Development (DHCD) may require resources and authorization to hire additional administrative staff to efficiently implement an expanded program. According to the Report on Commonwealth Connect 2.0: Governor Northam's 2020 Plan to Connect Virginia, to achieve full broadband connectivity, an investment of an additional \$278.0 million is required. The projected timeline in achieving full connectivity, as outlined in the report, extends through FY 2028. The portion of this funding that the department could commit through FY 2021 is unknown.
