21102735D **HOUSE JOINT RESOLUTION NO. 583** Offered January 14, 2021 3 Designating June 19 through the third Monday in July, in 2021 and in each succeeding year, as Liberty 4 Amendments Month in Virginia. 5 Patrons-Bagby, Keam, Carr, Hurst and Levine 6 7 Referred to Committee on Rules 8 9 WHEREAS, the Thirteenth, Fourteenth, Fifteenth, and Nineteenth Amendments to the Constitution of the United States, ratified between 1865 and 1920, provide voting rights and other rights that allow each 10 citizen to participate in the governance of their state and the United States; and 11 WHEREAS, these four amendments provide equal protections to all citizens of the United States, 12 13 regardless of race, color, sex, and the country from or method by which they or their ancestors came to the United States; and 14 WHEREAS, Section 1 of the Thirteenth Amendment to the Constitution of the United States reads: 15 "Neither slavery nor involuntary servitude, except as a punishment for a crime whereof the party shall 16 have been duly convicted, shall exist within the United States, or any place subject to their jurisdiction" 17 18 and was ratified on December 6, 1865; and 19 WHEREAS, Section 1 of the Fourteenth Amendment to the Constitution of the United States reads: 20 "All persons born or naturalized in the United States, and subject to the jurisdiction thereof, are citizens 21 of the United States and the State wherein they reside. No State shall make or enforce any law which 22 shall abridge the privileges or immunities of citizens of the United States; nor shall any State deprive 23 any person of life, liberty, or property, without due process of law; nor deny to any person within its 24 jurisdiction the equal protection of the laws" and was ratified on July 9, 1868; and 25 WHEREAS, Section 1 of the Fifteenth Amendment to the Constitution of the United States reads: 26 "The right of citizens of the United States to vote shall not be denied or abridged by the United States 27 or by any State on account of race, color, or previous condition of servitude" and was ratified on 28 February 3, 1870; and WHEREAS, the Nineteenth Amendment to the Constitution of the United States reads: "The right of 29 30 citizens of the United States to vote shall not be denied or abridged by the United States or by any State 31 on account of sex. Congress shall have power to enforce this article by appropriate legislation" and was 32 ratified on August 18, 1920; and 33 WHEREAS, the United States is strengthened and enriched by the diverse cultures that have 34 contributed and continue to contribute to the American melting pot, and these four amendments allow 35 citizens the freedom to recognize their ancestral heritage while integrating those traditions into American 36 culture; and 37 WHEREAS, the equal rights and freedoms granted by these four amendments should be recognized 38 and celebrated; now, therefore, be it 39 RESOLVED by the House of Delegates, the Senate concurring. That the General Assembly designate 40 June 19 through the third Monday in July, in 2021 and in each succeeding year, as Liberty Amendments 41 Month in Virginia; and, be it RESOLVED FURTHER, That the Clerk of the House of Delegates post the designation of this 42 43 month on the General Assembly's website.
