## **SENATE RESOLUTION NO. 92**

**3** Celebrating the life of Luther Hilton Foster. **4** 

## Patron-Ruff

5 6 WHEREAS, Luther Hilton Foster, a respected teacher, counselor, and school administrator, who was 7 a champion for African American students in the Commonwealth in the early 20th century, died on July 8 6, 1949; and 9 WHEREAS, a native of Clover, Luther Foster was born in 1888 and attended public schools in Halifax County; he subsequently graduated from Saint Paul's Polytechnic Institute, now Saint Paul's College, in Lawrenceville and the University of Chicago School of Commerce and Business 10 11 12 Administration; and 13 WHEREAS, Luther Foster began his career in education as a public school teacher, then worked as a 14 bookkeeper at Saint Paul's Polytechnic Institute for several years, before becoming the treasurer and 15 business manager of Virginia Normal and Industrial Institute, now Virginia State University, in 1913; 16 and WHEREAS, in 1943, Luther Foster was selected as the fourth president of Virginia Normal and 17 Industrial Institute, having previously served as acting president, and served in that capacity until his 18 19 death; and 20 WHEREAS, Luther Foster was the founder or member of several organizations designed to help 21 African American students achieve a good education and become successful leaders in their professions 22 and communities: and 23 WHEREAS, Luther Foster offered his expertise to the Boy Scouts of America as an advisor, was a 24 member of the Ancient Free and Accepted Masons, and enjoyed fellowship and worship with the Episcopal Church; and 25 WHEREAS, Luther Foster also served as a member of the executive board of the Protestant 26 27 Episcopal Diocese of Southern Virginia and a trustee and board member of Bishop Payne Divinity 28 School: and 29 WHEREAS, in 1950, Nottoway County Public Schools named Luther H. Foster High School in 30 Luther Foster's honor; the student activities building at Virginia State University also bears his name; 31 and 32 WHEREAS, among numerous awards and accolades, Luther Foster received honorary degrees from 33 Morris Brown College at Atlanta University and Virginia Union University; and 34 WHEREAS, Luther Foster married Daisy Octavia Poole of Surry County in 1913, and the couple had 35 three children, Luther, Jr., Virginia, and Mary; now, therefore, be it RESOLVED, That the Senate of Virginia hereby note with great sadness the loss of Luther Hilton 36 37 Foster, a highly admired educator who fought to ensure equity in education for African Americans; and, 38 be it 39 RESOLVED FURTHER, That the Clerk of the Senate prepare a copy of this resolution for 40 presentation to the family of Luther Hilton Foster as an expression of the Senate of Virginia's respect for 41 his memory.
