9 9	WHEREAS, educator, orator, and activist Booker T. Washington's life and legacy is deeply tied to
10	his roots in Virginia; and
11	WHEREAS, born into slavery in Franklin County, Booker T. Washington spent his childhood in
12	Virginia until, after emancipation, he moved with his family to West Virginia, where, at age nine, he
13	began working in salt furnaces and coal mines; during this time, he learned to read and write; and
14	WHEREAS, determined to continue his education, Booker T. Washington returned to Virginia and
15	enrolled in Hampton Normal and Agricultural Institute, now Hampton University; he excelled as a
16	student and after graduating returned to teach at Hampton Institute; and
17	WHEREAS, his time at Hampton Institute guided Booker T. Washington in founding Tuskegee
18	Normal and Industrial Institute in Alabama in 1881; at the time of its establishment, Tuskegee Institute's
19	first class held only 30 students, but in less than a decade the school expanded its enrollment to more
20	than 1,000 students; and
21	WHEREAS, Booker T. Washington worked tirelessly to bridge racial divides, to make education
22	available to all, and to advance civil rights; and
23	WHEREAS, in closing his autobiography, Up from Slavery, Booker T. Washington describes
24	returning to Virginia at the invitation of African American citizens of Richmond to speak to an
25	integrated audience that included the members of the Senate and the House of Delegates, who voted to
26	attend as a body, a testament to his life's work toward racial reconciliation; and
27	WHEREAS, in recognition of his legacy and contributions to the Commonwealth, it is fitting that
28	Booker T. Washington be honored with a statue in the Old Senate Chamber; now, therefore, be it
29	RESOLVED, That the Senate of Virginia support the establishment of a commemorative commission
30	to honor Booker T. Washington with a statue in the Old Senate Chamber; and, be it
31	RESOLVED FURTHER, That the Chairman of the Senate Committee on Rules be requested to
32	establish a commemorative commission (the Commission) that shall consist of the Chairman of the
33	Senate Committee on Rules, who shall serve as chairman thereof, the Clerk of the Senate, and four
34	other Senate members to be appointed by the Chairman of the Senate Committee on Rules.
35	The Commission shall study and recommend to the Senate of Virginia an appropriate statue in the
36	Old Senate Chamber to commemorate the life, achievements, and legacy of Booker T. Washington. [
37	The Capitol Square Preservation Council shall review the Commission's recommendation prior to the
38	recommendation being made to the Senate. ] All agencies of the Commonwealth shall provide assistance
39	to the Commission, upon request.
40	Until completion of the Commission's work or the erection of the statue, whichever occurs later, the
41	Commission shall report annually by December 1 the status of its work, including any findings and
42	recommendations, to the Senate of Virginia, beginning on December 1, 2021. The report shall be posted
43	on the General Assembly's website.
