3. Committee: Transportation

4. Title: Special identification cards; application by guardian.

5. Summary: This bill authorizes the parent of any person under the age of 18 or the legal guardian of any person to apply for a special identification card on behalf of such person. Current law authorizes the parent or legal guardian of any person under the age of 15 to apply for a special identification card on behalf of such person.

6. Budget Amendment Necessary: No.

7. Fiscal Impact Estimates: Preliminary. See Item #8.

8. Fiscal Implications: Currently, the parent or legal guardian of any person under the age of 15 may complete an application for a special identification card for their child or ward. This bill expands Code language to encompass individuals under the age of 18 and allows the legal guardians of individuals to submit special identification card applications for their wards, regardless of their age.

No fiscal impact is anticipated from this legislation.
