- 5. Summary: Directs the Department of Environmental Quality (DEQ) to convene and preside over two working groups. The first working group is to develop a new annual fee schedule for nonhazardous solid waste management facilities. DEQ is to submit to the Governor and the General Assembly by December 1, 2021, a summary of the working group's discussions and recommendations for a fee schedule that shall, at a minimum, be sufficient to reflect the direct costs of permitting, compliance, inspection, monitoring, training, and enforcement in the nonhazardous solid waste management program when aggregated and combined with other program permit fees. The second working group is to conduct a similar analysis of water withdrawal permit programs. DEQ is to submit to the Governor and the General Assembly by December 1, 2021 a summary of the working group's discussions and recommendations for a schedule of annual maintenance fees that shall, at a minimum, be sufficient to reflect no less than 40 percent of the direct costs required for the development, administration, compliance, and enforcement of such permits.
