4. Title: Department of Health; Eligible Health Care Provider Reserve Directory.

5. Summary: Directs the Department of Health to establish an Eligible Health Care Provider Reserve Directory (the Directory) to collect information regarding eligible health care providers in the Commonwealth who are qualified and who may be available to assist in the response to a public health emergency. The Directory shall include the name, contact information, and licensure, certification, or registration type and status of the eligible health care provider or, if the eligible health care provider is a fourth-year medical student, academic standing and anticipated graduation date of the fourth-year medical student. Every health regulatory board of the Department of Health Professions, the Office of Emergency Medical Services of the Department of Health, and each medical school located in the Commonwealth shall provide such information to the Department of Health for inclusion in the Directory.

8. Fiscal Implications: This bill, as amended, would require the Virginia Department of Health (VDH) to establish an Eligible Health Care Provider Reserve Director to collect information regarding eligible health care providers in the Commonwealth who are qualified and who may be available to assist in the response to a public health emergency. VDH would need a database to collect and store the information required. Since VDH does not have an existing database to collect information for the purposes of the Directory, one must be developed. VDH's Office of Information Management estimates that creation of the

necessary database will require 400 hours of staff time at a cost of \$36,000 and an annual maintenance cost of \$9,000 thereafter. Regular maintenance of the Directory, through a web portal, upload site, or similar, is necessary to ensure the database is kept up-to-date in a timely fashion. It is assumed the VDH can absorb these costs within existing resources.

This bill would not have a fiscal impact on the Department of Health Profession's health regulatory boards as they already collect this information.

This bill would not have a fiscal impact on Virginia's medical schools.
