5. Summary: Establishes a public defender office for the County of Chesterfield

8. Fiscal Implications: The proposed bill amends § 19.2-163.04, Code of Virginia, by adding the County of Chesterfield to the list of localities that may establish a public defender office.

According to the Virginia Indigent Defense Commission (VIDC), it will require 33 positions and \$3,060,354 to open a public defender office in Chesterfield County. The positions needed are shown in the table below:

Additionally, VIDC indicates the agency will need a systems administrator position to monitor operating systems, business applications, web servers, email and office personal computers. The estimated cost for a systems administrator is \$104,230.
