21200385D **HOUSE JOINT RESOLUTION NO. 542** 1 2 3 AMENDMENT IN THE NATURE OF A SUBSTITUTE (Proposed by the Senate Committee on Finance and Appropriations 4 5 6 on February 17, 2021) (Patron Prior to Substitute—Delegate McQuinn) Directing the Joint Legislative Audit and Review Commission to study transit equity and modernization 7 in the Commonwealth. Report. 8 WHEREAS, public transit is vital for the equitable growth of the Commonwealth's economy, 9 transportation infrastructure, and sustainability efforts; and 10 WHEREAS, people across the Commonwealth rely on public transit to reach employment opportunities, socialize with friends and family, connect with their communities, and meaningfully 11 participate in our society; and 12 WHEREAS, many transportation systems in the Commonwealth lack the necessary infrastructure to 13 14 provide essential public transit needs; and 15 WHEREAS, in order to make public transit in the Commonwealth a world-class transportation 16 system, we must analyze equity issues as we focus on improvements, increased efficiency, and 17 modernization: now. therefore, be it 18 RESOLVED by the House of Delegates, the Senate concurring, That the Joint Legislative Audit and 19 Review Commission be directed to study transit equity and modernization in the Commonwealth. 20 In conducting its study, the Joint Legislative Audit and Review Commission (JLARC) shall work 21 with the Department of Rail and Public Transportation (DRPT) to identify what is needed to achieve the equitable delivery of transportation services and modernization of transit in the Commonwealth. To the 22 extent feasible, JLARC shall incorporate its study under this joint resolution into any JLARC study of 23 transportation infrastructure that is currently in progress. With the cooperation of DRPT, all transit 24 25 agencies that receive funding pursuant to subdivision D 1 of § 33.2-1526.1 of the Code of Virginia, and any stakeholders that JLARC determines it is appropriate to include, JLARC shall study transit 26 27 accessibility, adequacy of transit infrastructure, transit electrification, implementation of emerging 28 technology, transit safety, and transit system engagement, with particular emphasis on transit services 29 and engagement opportunities for underserved and underrepresented communities. 30 Technical assistance shall be provided to the Joint Legislative Audit and Review Commission by the 31 Department of Rail and Public Transportation. All agencies of the Commonwealth shall provide 32 assistance to the Joint Legislative Audit and Review Commission for this study, upon request. 33 The Joint Legislative Audit and Review Commission shall submit to the Governor and the General 34 Assembly an interim report containing an executive summary of its activity and work no later than 35 December 1, 2021, and a final report containing an executive summary of its activities and 36 recommendations no later than August 1, 2022. The executive summaries and reports shall be submitted

as provided in the procedures of the Division of Legislative Automated Systems for the processing of

legislative documents and reports and shall be posted on the General Assembly's website.

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
