- 4. Title: Commonwealth Center for Recurrent Flooding Resiliency; study topics.
- **5. Summary:** Directs the Commonwealth Center for Recurrent Flooding Resiliency (CCRFR) to evaluate the development of a Flood Resiliency Clearinghouse Program for coordinating flood mitigation solutions. Requires the CCRFR to work with the Department of Conservation and Recreation to evaluate solutions that manage both water quality and flooding and emphasize nature-based solutions, including currently approved and not-yet-approved storm water best management practices. Requires the CCRFR to report the results of its findings to the Chairman of the House Committee on Agriculture, Chesapeake and Natural Resources and the Chairman of the Senate Committee on Agriculture, Conservation and Natural Resources by November 1, 2021,
