4. Title: Conditional release of geriatric or terminally ill inmates; notice to attorney for the Commonwealth.

5. Summary: The substitute engrossed bill requires the Virginia Parole Board (VPB) to notify by certified mail or by verifiable electronic means at least 21 business days prior to conditional release of any geriatric or terminally ill inmate convicted of a felony the attorney for the Commonwealth in the jurisdiction where the inmate was sentenced. The bill provides that this provision does not alter the obligations of the VPB under § 53.1-155, which governs investigation prior to release and transition assistance.

- **8. Fiscal Implications:** The VPB estimates that up to 879 offenders may be eligible for geriatric parole in FY2021. The substitute bill allows VPB to send notifications by certified mail or by verifiable electronic means. It is not feasible to determine at this time how many of these notifications will be made electronically or by certified mail. It is expected that the cost of mailing notifications by certified mail will be covered by the Department of Corrections (DOC), which processes certified mail on behalf of the VPB. According to DOC, this cost can be absorbed within the agency's existing budget. No additional personnel are required to carry out this function. The transmission of notification by electronic means is not expected to have material fiscal impact on the VPB.
