3. Committee: Passed by both houses.

4. Title: Certifications for victims of qualifying criminal activity.

5. Summary: The proposed legislation creates § 9.1-1500, § 9.1-1501, and § 9.1-1502, which establish a process for a certifying agency or certifying official, as defined in the bill, to complete a certification form or statement that is required by federal immigration law certifying that a person is a victim of qualifying criminal activity. The version of this bill passed by both chambers includes a technical amendment to § 9.1-1500 removing a federal or state judge or justice from the definition of a certifying official.

8. Fiscal Implications: The following agencies do not anticipate a fiscal impact as a result of the proposed legislation: the Virginia State Police, the Department of Juvenile Justice, the Department of Capitol Police, the Office of the State Inspector General, the Department of Conservation and Recreation, the Office of the Attorney General, the Department of Wildlife Resources, the Marine Resources Commission, and the Virginia Lottery.

The following agencies anticipate a minimal and absorbable fiscal impact as a result of the proposed legislation: the Department of Corrections, the Courts, the Virginia Alcoholic Beverage Control Authority, and the Compensation Board.

Information from the Department of Motor Vehicles, and institutions of higher education with a campus law-enforcement department is not available at this time.

Information is not available to determine the fiscal impact on local law enforcement agencies at this time.
