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## HOUSE BILL NO. 1023

AMENDMENT IN THE NATURE OF A SUBSTITUTE

(Proposed by the House Committee on Education

on February 7, 2022)

(Patron Prior to Substitute—Delegate Guzman)

A BILL to amend and reenact §§ 22.1-207.1 and 22.1-207.1.1 of the Code of Virginia, relating to high school family life education curricula; optional instruction on human trafficking of children. Be it enacted by the General Assembly of Virginia:

9 1. That §§ 22.1-207.1 and 22.1-207.1:1 of the Code of Virginia are amended and reenacted as 10 follows: 11

## § 22.1-207.1. Family life education.

12 A. As used in this section, "abstinence education" means an educational or motivational component 13 that has as its exclusive purpose teaching the social, psychological, and health gains to be realized by teenagers' abstaining from sexual activity before marriage. 14

15 B. The Board of Education shall develop Standards of Learning and curriculum guidelines for a 16 comprehensive, sequential family life education curriculum in grades kindergarten through 12. Such 17 curriculum guidelines shall include instruction as appropriate for the age of the student in family living and community relationships; the benefits, challenges, responsibilities, and value of marriage for men, 18 women, children, and communities; the value of family relationships; abstinence education; the value of 19 20 postponing sexual activity; the benefits of adoption as a positive choice in the event of an unwanted 21 pregnancy; human sexuality; human reproduction; the prevention of human trafficking, *including the* 22 human trafficking of children; dating violence, the characteristics of abusive relationships, steps to take 23 to deter sexual assault, the availability of counseling and legal resources, and, in the event of such 24 sexual assault, the importance of immediate medical attention and advice, as well as the requirements of the law; the etiology, prevention, and effects of sexually transmitted diseases; and mental health 25 26 education and awareness.

27 C. All such instruction shall be designed to promote parental involvement, foster positive 28 self-concepts, and provide mechanisms for coping with peer pressure and the stresses of modern living 29 according to the students' developmental stages and abilities. The Board shall also establish requirements 30 for appropriate training for teachers of family life education, which shall include training in instructional 31 elements to support the various curriculum components.

32 D. Each school board shall conduct a review of its family life education curricula at least once every 33 seven years, shall evaluate whether such curricula reflect contemporary community standards, and shall 34 revise such curricula if necessary. 35

## § 22.1-207.1:1. Family life education; certain curricula and Standards of Learning.

36 A. Any family life education curriculum offered by a local school division shall require the 37 Standards of Learning objectives related to dating violence and the characteristics of abusive 38 relationships to be taught at least once in middle school and at least twice in high school, as described 39 in the Board of Education's Board's family life education guidelines.

40 B. Any high school family life education curriculum offered by a local school division shall 41 incorporate age-appropriate elements of effective and evidence-based programs on (i) the prevention of dating violence, domestic abuse, sexual harassment, including sexual harassment using electronic means, 42 43 sexual violence, and human trafficking and (ii) the law and meaning of consent. Such age-appropriate 44 elements of effective and evidence-based programs on the prevention of sexual violence may include instruction that increases student awareness of the fact that consent is required before sexual activity. 45

C. Any family life education curriculum offered in any elementary school, middle school, or high 46 school shall incorporate age-appropriate elements of effective and evidence-based programs on the 47 **48** importance of the personal privacy and personal boundaries of other individuals and tools for a student 49 to use to ensure that he respects the personal privacy and personal boundaries of other individuals.

50 D. Any family life education curriculum offered by a local school division shall incorporate 51 age-appropriate elements of effective and evidence-based programs on the harmful physical and 52 emotional effects of female genital mutilation; associated criminal penalties; and the rights of the victim, 53 including any civil action pursuant to § 8.01-42.5.

E. Any family life education curriculum offered by a local school division may incorporate 54 55 age-appropriate elements of effective and evidence-based programs on the prevention, recognition, and awareness of child abduction, child abuse, child sexual exploitation, and child sexual abuse, and, in any 56 such curriculum offered in high school, human trafficking of children. 57

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
