10	Be it enacted by the General Assembly of Virginia:
11	1. That §§ 29.1-302 and 29.1-302.02 of the Code of Virginia are amended and reenacted as follows:
12	§ 29.1-302. Special license for certain resident disabled veterans.
13	Any resident veteran who is totally and permanently A. Certain resident veterans who are disabled
14	due to a service-connected disability as certified by the U.S. Department of Veterans Affairs may apply
15	for and receive at no cost from the Department a nontransferable license pursuant to 4VAC15-20-65,
16	valid for life, permitting the veteran to hunt and freshwater fish, or to hunt only or to freshwater fish
17	only, depending on which license is purchased, on any property in the Commonwealth according to
18	restrictions and regulations of law. However, this license shall not entitle the owner to fish in designated
19	waters stocked with trout by the Department or other public body.
20	B. The cost for a license under this section shall be:
21	1. For a resident veteran rated as totally and permanently disabled by the U.S. Department of
22	Veterans Affairs, no cost;
23	2. For a resident veteran rated 70 percent or more disabled, but less than totally and permanently
24	disabled, by the U.S. Department of Veterans Affairs, \$50;
25 26	3. For a resident veteran rated 50 percent or more disabled, but less than 70 percent disabled, by
20 27	the U.S. Department of Veterans Affairs, \$75; and 4. For a resident veteran rated 30 percent or more disabled, but less than 50 percent disabled, by
28	the U.S. Department of Veterans Affairs, \$100.
2 9	§ 29.1-302.02. Special resident and nonresident hunting and fishing licenses for partially
30	disabled veterans.
31	A. Any resident nonresident veteran who is rated by the U.S. Department of Veterans Affairs as
32	having at least a 70 percent service-connected disability, upon certification, shall pay an amount equal to
33	one-half the fee for the state resident nonresident basic hunting license required by subdivision 2 3 of
34	§ 29.1-303. Any nonresident veteran who is similarly rated, upon certification, shall pay an amount
35	equal to one-half the fee for the state nonresident license required by subdivision 3 of § 29.1-303. The
36	license fees established by this section may be revised by the Board pursuant to § 29.1-103.
37	B. Any resident nonresident veteran who is rated by the U.S. Department of Veterans Affairs as
38	having at least a 70 percent service-connected disability, upon certification, shall pay an amount equal to
39 40	one-half the fee for the state resident nonresident basic fishing license required by subdivision A $\frac{2}{3}$ of $\frac{8}{20}$ 1.310 Any nonresident veteran who is similarly rated upon certification shall nev an amount
