10	Whereas, Paul Jonas Crum, Jr., (Mr. Crum) spent more than five years in prison within the Virginia
11	Department of Corrections for conduct that did not amount to a crime; and
12	Whereas, on December 16, 2014, Mr. Crum was arrested and charged with obstruction of justice
13	pursuant to subsection C of § 18.2-460 of the Code of Virginia; and
14	Whereas, Mr. Crum, on the advice of his attorney, pleaded no contest to felony obstruction of justice
15	in Dickenson County Circuit Court; and
16	Whereas, on December 17, 2015, Mr. Crum was sentenced to 10 years in prison on the charge of
17	obstruction of justice; and
18	Whereas, on November 27, 2019, by unanimous decision, the Virginia Supreme Court granted Mr.
19	Crum's habeas corpus petition, vacated his conviction, and held that he was denied the effective
20	assistance of counsel because counsel advised Mr. Crum to plead no contest when his conduct did not
21	meet the elements of the offense; and
22	Whereas, the Commonwealth agreed with Mr. Crum's petition that his actions did not violate the
23	Code of Virginia; and
24 25	Whereas, Mr. Crum spent more than five years in prison as a result of his conviction for obstruction of justice; and
23 26	Whereas, Mr. Crum, as a result of his wrongful incarceration, lost more than five years of his
20 27	freedom and countless life experiences and opportunities, including family relations, the opportunity to
2 8	further his education, and the opportunity to earn potential income from gainful employment during his
29	years of incarceration; and
30	Whereas, Mr. Crum is 62 years of age and suffering from cancer; and
31	Whereas, Mr. Crum has no other means to obtain adequate relief except by action of this body; now,
32	therefore,
33	Be it enacted by the General Assembly of Virginia:
34	1. § 1. That there is hereby appropriated from the general fund of the state treasury the sum of [
35	\$249,044.00 \$289,068] for the relief of Paul Jonas Crum, Jr., to be paid by check issued by the State
36	Treasurer on warrant of the Comptroller upon execution of a release of all claims Mr. Crum may have
37	against the Commonwealth or any agency, instrumentality, office, employee, or political subdivision in
38 39	connection with the aforesaid occurrence. The compensation, subject to the execution of the release described herein, shall be paid as a single
40	lump sum to Mr. Crum by check issued by the State Treasurer on warrant of the Comptroller within 60
41	days immediately following the execution of such release.
42	§ 2. Mr. Crum shall be entitled to receive [career and technical training within the Virginia
43	Community College System free of tuition charges, up to a maximum of \$10,000. The cost for the tuition
44	benefit shall be paid by the community college at which the career or technical training is provided
45	reimbursement up to \$10,000 for tuition for career and technical training within the Virginia
46	Community College System contingent upon successful completion of the training. Reimbursement for
47	tuition shall be provided by the comprehensive community college at which the career or technical
48	training was completed]. The tuition benefit provided by this section shall expire on January 1, 2027.
49 50	§ 3. Any amount already paid to Mr. Crum as a transition assistance grant pursuant to subsection C
50 51	of § 8.01-195.11 of the Code of Virginia shall be deducted from any award received pursuant to § 1 of this act.
51 52	2. That the provisions of § 8.01-195.12 of the Code of Virginia shall apply to any compensation
52 53	awarded under this act.
