A BILL to amend and reenact §§ 32.1-122.7 and 32.1-122.7:2 and to amend the Code of Virginia by adding in Title 2.2 a chapter numbered 4.5, consisting of a section numbered 2.2-450, and by adding a section numbered 32.1-122.7:3, relating to health workforce development; Special Advisor to the Governor for Health Workforce Development; Virginia Health Workforce Development Fund.

12 Be it enacted by the General Assembly of Virginia:

1. That §§ 32.1-122.7 and 32.1-122.7:2 of the Code of Virginia are amended and reenacted and 13 14 that the Code of Virginia is amended by adding in Title 2.2 a chapter numbered 4.5, consisting of a section numbered 2.2-450, and by adding a section numbered 32.1-122.7:3, as follows: 15

CHAPTER 4.5.

SPECIAL ADVISOR FOR HEALTH WORKFORCE DEVELOPMENT.

§ 2.2-450. Special Advisor to the Governor for Health Workforce Development.

19 The position of Special Advisor to the Governor for Health Workforce Development is hereby created. The Special Advisor shall be appointed by the Governor and shall be responsible for 20 coordinating and aligning efforts to (i) expand the health workforce in the Commonwealth by improving 21 22 retention of existing staff and developing the health professions pipeline to support education, training, 23 and recruitment of new health workers and (ii) address regulatory, payment, and other issues that 24 negatively impact recruitment and retention of health workers in critical practice areas, including 25 behavioral health, nursing, and public health. 26

§ 32.1-122.7. Virginia Health Workforce Development Authority; purpose.

27 A. There is hereby created as a public body corporate and as a political subdivision of the 28 Commonwealth the Virginia Health Workforce Development Authority (the Authority), with such public and corporate powers as are set forth in § 32.1-122.7:2. The Authority is hereby constituted as a public 29 30 instrumentality, exercising public and essential governmental functions with the power and purpose to 31 provide for the health, welfare, convenience, knowledge, benefit, and prosperity of the residents of the Commonwealth and such other persons who might be served by the Authority. The Authority is 32 33 established to move the Commonwealth forward in achieving its vision of ensuring a quality health 34 workforce for all Virginians.

35 B. The mission of the Authority is to facilitate the development of a statewide health professions 36 pipeline that identifies, educates, recruits, and retains a diverse, appropriately geographically distributed, 37 and culturally competent quality workforce. The mission of the Authority is accomplished by: (i) 38 providing the statewide infrastructure required for health workforce needs assessment and planning that 39 maintains engagement by health professions training programs in decision making and program 40 implementation; (ii) serving as the advisory board and setting priorities for the Virginia Area Health 41 Education Centers Program; (iii) coordinating with and serving as a resource to relevant state, regional, and local entities, including the Department of Health Professions Workforce Data Center, the Joint 42 Legislative Audit and Review Commission, the Joint Commission on Health Care, the Southwest 43 44 Virginia Health Authority, or any similar regional health authority that may be developed; (iv) informing 45 state and local policy development as it pertains to health care delivery, training, and education; (v) identifying and promoting evidence-based strategies for health workforce pipeline development and 46 47 interdisciplinary health care service models, particularly those affecting rural and other underserved 48 areas; (vi) supporting communities in their health workforce recruitment and retention efforts and 49 developing partnerships and promoting models of participatory engagement with business and 50 community-based and social organizations to foster integration of health care training and education; 51 (vii) advocating for programs that will result in reducing the debt load of newly trained health 52 professionals; (viii) identifying high priority target areas within each region of the Commonwealth and working toward health workforce development initiatives that improve health measurably in those areas; 53 54 (ix) fostering or creating innovative health workforce development models that provide both health and 55 economic benefits to the regions they serve; (x) developing strategies to increase diversity in the health workforce by examining demographic data on race and ethnicity in training programs and health 56 57 professional licensure; (xi) identifying ways to leverage technology to increase access to health

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58 workforce training and health care delivery; and (xii) developing a centralized health care careers 59 roadmap in partnership with the Department of Health Professions that includes information on both 60 licensed and unlicensed professions and that is disseminated to the Commonwealth's health care 61 workforce stakeholders to raise awareness about available career pathways, and (xiii) working with the 62 Special Advisor to the Governer for Health Workforce Development, employers of health and health 63 science professionals, and institutions that provide education and training for health and health science 64 professionals to align education and training initiatives with existing and evolving health workforce 65 needs.

66 § 32.1-122.7:2. Powers and duties of the Virginia Health Workforce Development Authority; 67 exemptions.

68 A. The Authority is authorized to serve as the incorporated consortium of allopathic and osteopathic medical schools in Virginia as required by federal statute to qualify for the receipt of Area Health 69 70 Education Centers programs, legislatively mandated under the Public Health Service Act as amended, Title VII, Section 751, and 42 U.S.C. § 294a, and to administer federal, state, and local programs as 71 needed to carry out its public purpose and objectives. The Authority is further authorized to exercise 72 73 independently the powers conferred by this section in furtherance of its corporate and public purposes to 74 benefit citizens and such other persons who might be served by the Authority.

75 B. The Authority is authorized to monitor, collect, and track data pertaining to health care delivery, 76 training, and education from Virginia educational institutions and other entities as needed to carry out its 77 public purpose and objectives in areas where such data efforts do not already exist.

78 C. The Authority shall have the authority to assess policies, engage in policy development, and make 79 policy recommendations.

80 D. The Authority shall have the authority to apply for and accept federal, state, and local public and 81 private grants, loans, appropriations, and donations; hire and compensate staff, including an executive 82 director; rent, lease, buy, own, acquire, and dispose of property, real or personal; participate in joint ventures, including to make contracts and other agreements with public and private entities in order to 83 84 carry out its public purpose and objectives; and make bylaws for the management and regulation of its 85 affairs.

86 E. The Authority shall coordinate and seek opportunities to expand existing workforce development 87 initiatives in the Commonwealth to facilitate the development of the health workforce and shall partner 88 with an institution of higher education in the Commonwealth to facilitate the sharing of information and 89 resources and strengthen efforts to develop the health workforce in the Commonwealth.

90 F. The Authority shall be exempt from the provisions of Chapters 29 (§ 2.2-2900 et seq.) and 43 91 (§ 2.2-4300 et seq.) of Title 2.2.

92 F. G. The exercise of powers granted by this article and the undertaking of activities in the 93 furtherance of the purpose of the Authority shall constitute the performance of essential governmental 94 functions. Therefore, the Authority shall be exempt from any tax or assessment upon any project or 95 property acquired or used by the Authority under the provisions of this article or upon the income 96 therefrom, including sales and use taxes on tangible personal property used in the operation of the 97 Authority. This exemption shall not extend to persons conducting business for which local or state taxes 98 would otherwise be required. 99

§ 32.1-122.7:3. Virginia Health Workforce Development Fund.

100 A. There is hereby created in the state treasury a special nonreverting fund to be known as the Virginia Health Workforce Development Fund, referred to in this section as "the Fund." The Fund shall 101 102 be established on the books of the Comptroller. All funds appropriated for such purpose and any gifts, donations, grants, bequests, and other funds received on its behalf shall be paid into the state treasury 103 104 and credited to the Fund. Interest earned on moneys in the Fund shall remain in the Fund and be 105 credited to it. Any moneys remaining in the Fund, including interest thereon, at the end of each fiscal 106 year shall not revert to the general fund but shall remain in the Fund. Moneys in the Fund shall be used solely for the purposes of (i) supporting the work of the Virginia Health Workforce Development 107 Authority and (ii) funding grants to regional health and health science workforce development initiatives 108 109 in accordance with subsection B. Expenditures and disbursements from the Fund shall be made by the 110 State Treasurer on warrants issued by the Comptroller upon written request signed by the 111 Commissioner.

112 B. The Authority shall establish a process for the issuance of grants to regional health and health science workforce development initiatives established to meet regional health and health science 113 114 workforce needs by developing and supporting targeted initiatives to address unique regional needs 115 related to health and health science workforce education, training, recruitment, and retention.
