22102425D **HOUSE BILL NO. 354** 1 2 House Amendments in [] — February 14, 2022 3 A BILL to amend and reenact § 2.2-231 of the Code of Virginia and to amend the Code of Virginia by 4 adding in Article 11 of Chapter 2 of Title 2.2 a section numbered 2.2-233.1, relating to the Virginia 5 Military Community Infrastructure Grant Program and Fund. 6 7 Patron Prior to Engrossment-Delegate Tata 8 9 Referred to Committee on General Laws 10 11 Be it enacted by the General Assembly of Virginia: 1. That § 2.2-231 of the Code of Virginia is amended and reenacted and that the Code of Virginia 12 is amended by adding in Article 11 of Chapter 2 of Title 2.2 a section numbered 2.2-233.1 as 13 14 follows: 15 § 2.2-231. Powers and duties of the Secretary. Unless the Governor expressly reserves such power to himself, the Secretary shall: 16 17 1. Serve as the Governor's liaison for veterans affairs and provide active outreach to the U.S. Department of Veterans Affairs, the veterans service organizations, and the veterans community in 18 Virginia to support and assist Virginia's veterans in identifying and obtaining the services, assistance, 19 20 and support to which they are entitled. 21 2. Work with federal officials to obtain additional federal resources and coordinate veterans policy 22 development and information exchange. 3. Work with and through appropriate members of the Governor's Cabinet to coordinate working 23 24 relationships between state agencies and take all actions necessary to ensure that available federal and 25 state resources are directed toward assisting veterans and addressing all issues of mutual concern to the Commonwealth and the armed forces of the United States, including quality of life issues unique to 26 Virginia's active duty military personnel and their families, the quality of educational opportunities for 27 28 military children, the future of federal impact aid, preparedness, public safety and security concerns, transportation needs, alcoholic beverage law enforcement, substance abuse, social service needs, possible 29 30 expansion and growth of military facilities in the Commonwealth, and intergovernmental support agreements with state and local governments under the provisions of 10 U.S.C. § 2336. 31 32 4. Educate the public on veterans and defense issues in coordination with applicable state agencies. 33 5. Serve as chairman of the Virginia Military Advisory Council to establish a working relationship 34 with Virginia's active duty military bases. 35 6. Monitor and enhance efforts to provide assistance and support for veterans living in Virginia and 36 members of the Virginia National Guard and Virginia residents in the Armed Forces Reserves not in 37 active federal service in the areas of (i) medical care, (ii) mental health and rehabilitative services, (iii) 38 housing, (iv) homelessness prevention, (v) job creation, and (vi) education. 39 7. Seek additional federal resources to support veterans services. 40 8. Monitor efforts to provide services to veterans, those members of the Virginia National Guard, and 41 Virginia residents in the Armed Forces Reserves who qualify for veteran status, and their immediate family members, including the dissemination of relevant materials and the rendering of technical or 42 43 other advice. 44 9. Serve as the Governor's liaison and provide active outreach to localities of the Commonwealth and 45 veterans support organizations in the development, implementation, and review of local veterans services programs as part of the state program. 46 10. Serve as the Governor's defense liaison and provide active outreach to the U.S. Department of 47 **48** Defense and the defense establishment in Virginia to support the military installations and activities in the Commonwealth to continue to enhance Virginia's current military-friendly environment, and foster 49 50 and promote business, technology, transportation, education, economic development, and other efforts in 51 support of the mission, execution, and transformation of the United States government military and national defense activities located in the Commonwealth. 52 53 11. Promote the industrial and economic development of localities included in or adjacent to United 54 States government military and other national defense activities and those of the Commonwealth because the success of such activities depends on cooperation between the localities, the Commonwealth, and the 55 United States military and national defense activities. 56 12. Provide technical assistance and coordination between the Commonwealth, its political 57 subdivisions, and the United States government military and national defense activities located within the 58 59 Commonwealth.

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60 13. Employ, as needed, consultants, attorneys, architects, engineers, accountants, financial experts, 61 investment bankers, superintendents, managers, and such other employees and agents as may be 62 necessary, and to fix their compensation to be payable from funds made available for that purpose.

63 14. Receive and accept from any federal or private agency, foundation, corporation, association, or 64 person grants, donations of money, real property, or personal property for the benefit of the 65 Commonwealth and receive and accept from the Commonwealth or any state, any municipality, county, 66 or other political subdivision thereof, and from any other source, aid or contributions of money, property, or other things of value, to be held, used, and applied for the purposes for which such grants 67 68 and contributions may be made.

15. Receive and accept from any source aid, grants, and contributions of money, property, labor, or 69 other things of value to be held, used, and applied to carry out these requirements subject to the 70 71 conditions upon which the aid, grants, or contributions are made.

72 16. Make grants to local governments, state and federal agencies, and private entities with any funds 73 of the Secretary available for such purpose.

74 17. Take any actions necessary or convenient to the exercise of the powers granted or reasonably 75 implied to this Secretary and not otherwise inconsistent with the law of the Commonwealth.

76 18. Work with veterans services organizations and counterparts in other states to monitor and 77 encourage the timely and accurate processing of veterans benefit requests by the U.S. Department of 78 Veterans Affairs, including requests for services connected to health care, mental health care, and 79 disability payments.

80 19. In conjunction with subdivision 6, coordinate with federal, state, local, and private partners to 81 assist homeless veterans in obtaining a state-issued identification card, in order to enable these veterans to access the available federal, state, local, and other resources they need to attain financial stability or 82 83 address other issues that have adversely affected their lives.

84 20. Develop a grant application, procedures, and guidelines for and oversee the implementation and 85 administration of the Virginia Military Community Infrastructure Grant Program and Fund. 86

§ 2.2-233.1. Virginia Military Community Infrastructure Grant Program and Fund.

87 A. There is hereby created in the state treasury a special nonreverting fund to be known as the 88 Virginia Military Community Infrastructure Grant Fund. The Fund shall be established on the books of 89 the Comptroller. All funds appropriated for such purpose and any gifts, donations, grants, bequests, and 90 other funds received on its behalf shall be paid into the state treasury and credited to the Fund. Interest 91 earned on moneys in the Fund shall remain in the Fund and be credited to it. Any moneys remaining in 92 the Fund, including interest thereon, at the end of a biennium shall not revert to the general fund but 93 shall remain in the Fund. Moneys in the Fund shall be used, in the sole discretion of the Governor, to 94 provide an annual grant award to eligible military communities in the Commonwealth and carry out the 95 purposes of the Virginia Military Community Infrastructure Grant Program described in subsection B. 96 Expenditures and disbursements from the Fund shall be made by the State Treasurer on warrants issued 97 by the Comptroller upon written request signed by the Secretary.

B. The Fund shall be used by the Governor to support military communities in the Commonwealth by 98 99 awarding grants to aid the planning and design, construction, or completion of infrastructure projects 100 that enhance military readiness, installation resiliency, or quality of life for [ fenceline communities, as defined in § 2.2-234 military communities]. Any such project shall be clearly defined, shall include a 101 measurable outcome in support of the task force mission of protecting military installations in the 102 103 Commonwealth, and shall typically be completed within two years of contracting.

104 C. The Secretary shall develop guidance and criteria to be used in awarding grants under the 105 Program, and an annual grant application, which shall include, at a minimum, requirements for the 106 grantee to: 107

1. Report expenditures each quarter;

108 2. Retain all invoices, bills, receipts, canceled checks, proof of payment, and similar documentation 109 to substantiate expenditures of grant funding; 110

3. Provide a 50 percent cash match from nonstate funds; and

4. Return excess state grant funding within 30 days after the term of the grant expires.

112 D. Prior to the distribution of any funds, any grantee seeking funding pursuant to this section shall submit a grant application to the Secretary for consideration. The Commonwealth shall have the right to 113 114 make inspections and copies of the books and records of a grantee at any time. A grantee shall undergo an audit for the grant period and provide a copy of the audit report to the Secretary. 115

E. As used in this section:

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"Fund" means the Virginia Military Community Infrastructure Grant Fund created pursuant to this 117 118 section.

"Infrastructure" means any project that will (i) preserve, protect, and enhance military installations; 119 (ii) support the state's position in research and development related to or arising out of military 120 121 missions and contracting; and (iii) improve the military-friendly environment for service members,

- 122 military dependents, military retirees, and businesses that bring military-related and base-related jobs to the Commonwealth.
- 122 123 124 125 126 "Military community" means any locality that can demonstrate that more than five percent of the community's economy is derived from military funding.
- "Program" means the Virginia Military Community Infrastructure Grant Program created pursuant 127 to this section.
