13	§ 8.01-44.8. Civil action for malicious prosecution; self-defense.
14	A. Notwithstanding any other provision of law, in any case in which a criminal defendant is charged
15	with aggravated murder, murder in the first degree, murder in the second degree, or voluntary
16	manslaughter, and such criminal defendant is found to have acted solely in self-defense, such defendant
17	shall have a civil cause of action for malicious prosecution against the prosecutor who brought the
18	charges or prosecuted such criminal case if such criminal defendant can prove that such prosecution
19 20	was malicious and motivated by reasons other than bringing the alleged defendant to justice.
20 21	B. If the provisions of subsection A are met, the criminal defendant bringing such an action shall be entitled to compensatory damages incurred by such defendant as result of such prosecution, as well as
22	court costs and reasonable attorney fees. If compensatory damages are awarded, such criminal
