12 Be it enacted by the General Assembly of Virginia:

13 1. That §§ 58.1-603.1, as it is currently effective and as it may become effective, 58.1-603.2,
 14 58.1-604.01, as it is currently effective and as it may become effective, 58.1-605.1, 58.1-606.1,
 15 58.1-611.1, 58.1-638, and 58.1-2425, as it is currently effective and as it may become effective, of
 16 the Code of Virginia are amended and reenacted as follows:

\$ 58.1-603.1. (For contingent expiration dates, see Acts 2013, c. 766, and Acts 2020, c. 1235)
Additional state sales tax in certain counties and cities.

A. In addition to the sales tax imposed pursuant to § 58.1-603, there is hereby levied and imposed in 19 20 each county and city located in a Planning District established pursuant to Chapter 42 (§ 15.2-4200 et 21 seq.) of Title 15.2 that (i) as of January 1, 2013, has a population of 1.5 million or more as shown by 22 the most recent United States Census, has not less than 1.2 million motor vehicles registered therein, and 23 has a total transit ridership of not less than 15 million riders per year across all transit systems within 24 the Planning District or (ii) as shown by the most recent United States Census meets the population 25 criteria set forth in clause (i) and also meets the vehicle registration and ridership criteria set forth in clause (i), a retail sales tax at the rate of 0.70 percent. In any case in which the tax is imposed pursuant 26 27 to clause (ii) such tax shall be effective beginning on the July 1 immediately following the calendar year 28 in which all of the criteria have been met.

B. In addition to the sales tax imposed pursuant to § 58.1-603, there is hereby levied and imposed in each county and city located in Planning District 15 established pursuant to Chapter 42 (§ 15.2-4200 et seq.) of Title 15.2 a retail sales tax at the rate of 0.70 percent. In no case shall an additional sales tax be imposed pursuant to both clause (ii) of subsection A and this subsection.

C. The tax imposed pursuant to subsections A and B shall not be levied upon food purchased for human consumption and essential personal hygiene products, as such terms are defined in § 58.1-611.1. Such tax shall be added to the rate of the state sales tax imposed pursuant to § 58.1-603 in each such county and city and shall be subject to all the provisions of this chapter and the rules and regulations published with respect thereto. No discount under § 58.1-622 shall be allowed for the tax imposed under this section. Such tax shall be administered and collected by the Tax Commissioner in the same manner and subject to the same penalties as provided for the state sales tax under § 58.1-603.

40 D. The revenue generated and collected pursuant to the tax authorized under this section, less the 41 applicable portion of any refunds to taxpayers, shall be deposited by the Comptroller into special funds established by law. In the case of Planning District 8, the revenue generated and collected therein shall 42 be deposited into the fund established in § 33.2-2509. In the case of Planning District 23, the revenue 43 44 generated and collected therein shall be deposited into the fund established in § 33.2-2600. In the case of Planning District 15, the revenue generated and collected therein shall be deposited into the fund 45 established in § 33.2-3701. For additional planning districts that may become subject to this section, 46 47 funds shall be established by appropriate legislation.

50 In addition to the sales tax imposed pursuant to § 58.1-603, there is hereby levied and imposed in 51 each county and city located in a Planning District established pursuant to Chapter 42 (§ 15.2-4200 et seq.) of Title 15.2 that (i) as of January 1, 2013, has a population of 1.5 million or more as shown by 52 53 the most recent United States Census, has not less than 1.2 million motor vehicles registered therein, and 54 has a total transit ridership of not less than 15 million riders per year across all transit systems within the Planning District or (ii) as shown by the most recent United States Census meets the population 55 criteria set forth in clause (i) and also meets the vehicle registration and ridership criteria set forth in 56 57 clause (i), a retail sales tax at the rate of 0.70 percent. 73 § 58.1-603.2. (For contingent expiration date, see Acts 2018, c. 850) Additional state sales and 74 use tax in certain counties and cities of historic significance; Historic Triangle Marketing Fund.

A. For purposes of this section, "Historic Triangle" means all of the City of Williamsburg and the Counties of James City and York.

B. In addition to the sales tax imposed pursuant to §§ 58.1-603 and 58.1-603.1, there is hereby levied 77 78 and imposed in the Historic Triangle a retail sales tax at the rate of one percent. Such tax shall not be 79 levied upon food purchased for human consumption and essential personal hygiene products, as such 80 terms are defined in § 58.1-611.1. Such tax shall be added to the rate of the state sales tax imposed pursuant to §§ 58.1-603 and 58.1-603.1 in each such county and city and shall be subject to all the 81 provisions of this chapter and the rules and regulations published with respect thereto. No discount 82 83 under § 58.1-622 shall be allowed for the tax imposed under this section. Such tax shall be administered and collected by the Tax Commissioner in the same manner and subject to the same penalties as 84 85 provided for the state sales tax under § 58.1-603.

86 C. In addition to the use tax imposed pursuant to §§ 58.1-604 and 58.1-604.01, there is hereby levied 87 and imposed in the Historic Triangle a retail use tax at the rate of one percent. the Comptroller under the name "Collections of Historic Triangle Sales Tax" and distributed to the
locality in which the sales or use tax was collected. The revenues received by a locality pursuant to this

105 E. 1. There is hereby created in the state treasury a special nonreverting fund to be known as the Historic Triangle Marketing Fund, referred to in this section as "the Fund," to be managed and administered by the Tourism Council of the Greater Williamsburg Chamber and Tourism Alliance. The 106 107 108 Fund shall be established on the books of the Comptroller. All revenues generated pursuant to this 109 section shall be paid into the state treasury and credited to the Fund. Interest earned on moneys in the 110 Fund shall remain in the Fund and be credited to it. Any moneys remaining in the Fund, including 111 interest thereon, at the end of each fiscal year shall not revert to the general fund but shall remain in the 112 Fund. Moneys in the Fund shall be used solely for the purposes of marketing, advertising, and promoting the Historic Triangle area as an overnight tourism destination, with the intent to attract 113 114 visitors from a sufficient distance so as to require an overnight stay of at least one night, as set forth in this subsection. Expenditures and disbursements from the Fund shall be made by the State Treasurer on 115 116 warrants issued by the Comptroller upon written request signed by the Secretary of Finance.

2. The Tourism Council of the Greater Williamsburg Chamber and Tourism Alliance (the Council)
shall consist of members as follows: one member of the James City County Board of Supervisors, one
member of the York County Board of Supervisors; one member of the Williamsburg City Council, one
representative of the Colonial Williamsburg Foundation, one representative of the Jamestown-Yorktown
Foundation, one representative of Busch Gardens Williamsburg, one representative of Historic

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Jamestowne, one representative of the Williamsburg Hotel and Motel Association, and one representative
of the Williamsburg Area Restaurant Association. The Chief Executive Officer of the Virginia Tourism
Alliance and the Chief Executive Officer of the Virginia Tourism Corporation shall serve as ex officio,
non-voting members of the Council.

126 3. The Council shall establish the Historic Triangle Office of Marketing and Promotion (the Office) 127 to administer a program of marketing, advertising, and promotion to attract visitors to the Historic 128 Triangle area, as required by this subsection. The Council shall use moneys in the Fund to fund the pay 129 for necessary expenses of the Office and to fund the activities of the Office. The Office shall be 130 overseen by a professional with extensive experience in marketing or advertising and in the tourism 131 industry. The Office shall be responsible for (i) developing and implementing, in consultation with the 132 Council, long-term and short-term strategic plans for advertising and promoting the numerous facilities, 133 venues, and attractions devoted to education, historic preservation, amusement, entertainment, and dining 134 in the Historic Triangle as a cohesive and unified travel destination for local, national, and international 135 travelers; (ii) assisting, upon request, with the coordination of cross-advertising and cross-marketing 136 efforts between various tourism venues and destinations in the Historic Triangle region; (iii) identifying 137 strategies for both increasing the number of overnight visitors to the region and increasing the average 138 length of stay of tourists in the region; and (iv) performing any other function related to the promotion 139 of the Historic Triangle region as may be identified by the Council.

4. The Council shall report annually on its long-term and short-term strategic plans and the implementation of such plans; marketing efforts; metrics regarding tourism in the Historic Triangle region; use of the funds in the Fund; and any other details relevant to the work of the Council and the Office. Such report shall be delivered no later than December 1 of each year to the managers or chief executive officers of the City of Williamsburg and the Counties of James City and York, and to the Chairmen of the House Committees on Finance and Appropriations and the Senate Committee on Finance and Appropriations.

In addition to the use tax imposed pursuant to § 58.1-604, there is hereby levied and imposed in 150 each county and city located in a Planning District established pursuant to Chapter 42 (§ 15.2-4200 et 151 seq.) of Title 15.2 that (i) as of January 1, 2013, has a population of 1.5 million or more, as shown by 152 the most recent United States Census, has not less than 1.2 million motor vehicles registered therein, and 153 has a total transit ridership of not less than 15 million riders per year across all transit systems within 154 the Planning District or (ii) as shown by the most recent United States Census meets the population 155 criteria set forth in clause (i) and also meets the vehicle registration and ridership criteria set forth in 156 clause (i), a retail use tax at the rate of 0.70 percent. In any case in which the tax is imposed pursuant 157 to clause (ii) such tax shall be effective beginning on the July 1 immediately following the calendar year 158 in which all of the criteria have been met.

In addition to the use tax imposed pursuant to § 58.1-604, there is hereby levied and imposed in each county and city located in a Planning District established pursuant to Chapter 42 (§ 15.2-4200 et seq.) of Title 15.2 that (i) as of January 1, 2013, has a population of 1.5 million or more, as shown by the most recent United States Census, has not less than 1.2 million motor vehicles registered therein, and has a

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183 total transit ridership of not less than 15 million riders per year across all transit systems within the 184 Planning District or (ii) as shown by the most recent United States Census meets the population criteria 185 set forth in clause (i) and also meets the vehicle registration and ridership criteria set forth in clause (i), 186 a retail use tax at the rate of 0.70 percent. In any case in which the tax is imposed pursuant to clause (ii) such tax shall be effective beginning on the July 1 immediately following the calendar year in which 187 188 all of the criteria have been met. 202 § 58.1-605.1. Additional local sales tax in certain localities; use of revenues for construction or 203 renovation of schools.

A. 1. In addition to the sales tax authorized under § 58.1-605, a qualifying locality may levy a general retail sales tax at a rate not to exceed one percent as determined by its governing body to provide revenue solely for capital projects for the construction or renovation of schools in each such locality. Such tax shall be added to the rates of the state and local sales tax imposed by this chapter and shall be subject to all the provisions of this chapter and the rules and regulations published with respect thereto. No discount under § 58.1-622 shall be allowed on this local sales tax.

2. Any tax imposed pursuant to this section shall expire (i) if the capital projects for the construction
or renovation of schools are to be financed by bonds or loans, on the date by which such bonds or loans
shall be repaid or (ii) if the capital projects for the construction or renovation of schools are not to be
financed by bonds or loans, on a date chosen by the governing body and specified in any resolution
passed pursuant to the provisions of subdivision B 1. Such expiration date shall not be more than 20
years after the date of the resolution passed pursuant to the provisions of subdivision B 1.

B. 1. This tax may be levied only if the tax is approved in a referendum within the qualifying
locality held in accordance with § 24.2-684 and initiated by a resolution of the local governing body.
Such resolution shall state (i) if the capital projects for the construction or renovation of schools are to
be financed by bonds or loans, the date by which such bonds or loans shall be repaid or (ii) if the
capital projects for the construction or renovation of schools are not to be financed by bonds or loans, a
specified date on which the sales tax shall expire.

222 2. The clerk of the circuit court shall publish notice of the referendum in a newspaper of general
223 circulation in the qualifying locality once a week for three consecutive weeks prior to the election. The
224 question on the ballot for the referendum shall include language stating (i) that the revenues from the
225 sales tax shall be used solely for capital projects for the construction or renovation of schools and (ii)
226 the date on which the sales tax shall expire.

C. The governing body of the qualifying locality, if it elects to impose a local sales tax under this section after approval at a referendum as provided in subsection B shall do so by the adoption of an ordinance stating its purpose and referring to this section and providing that such ordinance shall be effective on the first day of a month at least 120 days after its adoption. Such ordinance shall be forwarded to the Tax Commissioner so that it will be received within five days after its adoption.

D. Any local sales tax levied under this section shall be administered and collected by the Tax
 Commissioner in the same manner and subject to the same exemptions and penalties as provided for the
 state sales tax; however, the local sales tax levied under this section shall not be levied on food
 purchased for human consumption or essential personal hygiene products, as such terms are defined in
 § 58.1-611.1.

E. All local sales tax moneys collected by the Tax Commissioner under this section shall be paid
into the state treasury to the credit of a special fund that is hereby created on the Comptroller's books
for each qualifying locality under the name "Collections of Additional Local Sales Taxes in

F. As soon as practicable after the local sales tax moneys have been paid into the state treasury in

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245 any month for the preceding month, the Comptroller shall draw his warrant on the State Treasurer in the 246 proper amount in favor of each qualifying locality, and such payments shall be charged to the account 247 of the qualifying locality under its special fund created by this section. If errors are made in any such 248 payment, or adjustments are otherwise necessary, whether attributable to refunds to taxpayers or to some 249 other fact, the errors shall be corrected and adjustments made in the payments for the next two months 250 as follows: one-half of the total adjustment shall be included in the payment for each of the next two 251 months. In addition, the payment shall include a refund of amounts erroneously not paid to each 252 qualifying locality and not previously refunded during the three years preceding the discovery of the 253 error. A correction and adjustment in payments described in this subsection due to the misallocation of funds by the dealer shall be made within three years of the date of the payment error. 254

G. The revenues from this tax shall be used solely for capital projects for new construction or major
 renovation of schools in the qualifying locality, including bond and loan financing costs related to such construction or renovation.

258 § 58.1-606.1. Additional local use tax in certain localities; use of revenues for construction or renovation of schools.

A. 1. The governing body of a qualifying locality may levy a use tax at the rate of such sales tax under § 58.1-605.1 to provide revenue for capital projects for the construction or renovation of schools in such locality. Such tax shall be added to the rates of the state and local use tax imposed by this chapter and shall be subject to all the provisions of this chapter, and all amendments thereof, and the rules and regulations published with respect thereto, except that no discount under § 58.1-622 shall be allowed on a local use tax.

2. Any tax imposed pursuant to this section shall expire (i) if the capital projects for the construction
or renovation of schools are to be financed by bonds or loans, on the date by which such bonds or loans
shall be repaid or (ii) if the capital projects for the construction or renovation of schools are not to be
financed by bonds or loans, on a date chosen by the governing body and specified in any resolution
passed pursuant to the provisions of subsection B. Such expiration date shall not be more than 20 years
after the date of the resolution passed pursuant to the provisions of subsection B.

B. The governing body of the qualifying locality, if it elects to impose a local use tax under this section may do so only if it has previously imposed the local sales tax authorized by § 58.1-605.1, by the adoption of an ordinance stating its purpose and referring to this section and providing that the local use tax shall become effective on the first day of a month at least 120 days after its adoption. Such ordinance shall state the date on which the use tax shall expire. A certified copy of such ordinance shall be forwarded to the Tax Commissioner so that it will be received within five days after its adoption.

C. Any local use tax levied under this section shall be administered and collected by the Tax
Commissioner in the same manner and subject to the same exemptions and penalties as provided for the
state use tax; however, the local use tax levied under this section shall not be levied on food purchased
for human consumption or essential personal hygiene products, as such terms are defined in
§ 58.1-611.1.

283 D. The local use tax authorized by this section shall not apply to transactions to which the sales tax 284 applies, the situs of which for state and local sales tax purposes is the locality of location of each place 285 of business of every dealer paying the tax to the Commonwealth without regard to the locality of 286 possible use by the purchasers. However, the local use tax authorized by this section shall apply to 287 tangible personal property purchased outside the Commonwealth for use or consumption within the 288 locality imposing the local use tax, or stored within the locality for use or consumption, where the 289 property would have been subject to the sales tax if it had been purchased within the Commonwealth. 290 The local use tax shall also apply to leases or rentals of tangible personal property where the place of 291 business of the lessor is outside the Commonwealth and such leases or rentals are subject to the state 292 tax. Moreover, the local use tax shall apply in all cases in which the state use tax applies.

E. Out-of-state dealers who hold certificates of registration to collect the use tax from their customers for remittance to the Commonwealth shall, to the extent reasonably practicable, in filing their monthly use tax returns with the Tax Commissioner, break down their shipments into the Commonwealth by counties and cities so as to show the county or city of destination. If, however, the out-of-state dealer is unable accurately to assign any shipment to a particular county or city, the local use tax on the tangible personal property involved shall be remitted to the Commonwealth by such dealer without attempting to assign the shipment to any county or city.

F. Local use tax revenue shall be deposited in the special fund established pursuant to subsection Eof § 58.1-605.1. The Comptroller shall distribute the revenue to the qualifying locality.

302 G. All revenue from this local use tax revenue shall be used solely for capital projects for new
 303 construction or major renovation of schools in the qualifying locality, including bond and loan financing
 304 costs related to such construction or renovation.

305 § 58.1-611.1. Exemption for food purchased for human consumption and essential personal

306 hygiene products.

307 A. The tax imposed by §§ 58.1-603 and 58.1-604 on food purchased for human consumption and 308 essential personal hygiene products shall be one and one-half percent of the gross sales price. The 309 revenue from the tax shall be distributed as follows: (i) the revenue from the tax at the rate of one-half 310 percent shall be distributed as provided in subsection A of § 58.1-638 and (ii) the revenue from the tax 311 at the rate of one percent shall be distributed as provided in subsections B, C and D of § 58.1-638.

312 B. The provisions of this section shall not affect the imposition of tax on food purchased for human 313 consumption and essential personal hygiene products pursuant to §§ 58.1-605 and 58.1-606.

314 C. No tax shall be imposed under this chapter, or pursuant to any authority granted under this 315 chapter, on food purchased for human consumption or essential personal hygiene products.

B. 1. As used in this section, "food purchased for human consumption" has the same meaning as 316 "food" defined in the Food Stamp Act of 1977, 7 U.S.C. § 2012, as amended, and federal regulations 317 318 adopted pursuant to that Act, except it shall not include seeds and plants which produce food for human consumption. For the purpose of this section, "food purchased for human consumption" shall not include 319 320 food sold by any retail establishment where the gross receipts derived from the sale of food prepared by 321 such retail establishment for immediate consumption on or off the premises of the retail establishment 322 constitutes more than 80 percent of the total gross receipts of that retail establishment, including but not 323 limited to motor fuel purchases, regardless of whether such prepared food is consumed on the premises 324 of that retail establishment. For purposes of this section, "retail establishment" means each place of business for which any "dealer," as defined in § 58.1-612, is required to apply for and receive a 325 certificate of registration pursuant to § 58.1-613. 326

327 2. As used in this section, "essential personal hygiene products" means (i) nondurable incontinence 328 products such as diapers, disposable undergarments, pads, and bed sheets and (ii) menstrual cups and pads, pantyliners, sanitary napkins, tampons, and other products used to absorb or contain menstrual flow. "Essential personal hygiene products" does not include any item that is otherwise exempt pursuant 329 330 331 to this chapter. 332

§ 58.1-638. Disposition of state sales and use tax revenue.

333 A. The Comptroller shall designate a specific revenue code number for all the state sales and use tax 334 revenue collected under the preceding sections of this chapter.

335 The sales and use tax revenue generated by the one-half percent sales and use tax increase enacted 336 by the 1986 Special Session of the General Assembly shall be paid, in the manner hereinafter provided 337 in this section, to the Commonwealth Transportation Fund established pursuant to § 33.2-1524. The 338 Fund's share of such net revenue shall be computed as an estimate of the net revenue to be received into 339 the state treasury each month, and such estimated payment shall be adjusted for the actual net revenue 340 received in the preceding month. All payments shall be made to the Fund on the last day of each 341 month.

342 B. The sales and use tax revenue generated by a one 1.182 percent sales and use tax shall be 343 distributed among the counties and cities of the Commonwealth in the manner provided in subsections C 344 and D.

345 C. The localities' share of the net revenue distributable under this section among the counties and cities shall be apportioned by the Comptroller and distributed among them by warrants of the 346 347 Comptroller drawn on the Treasurer of Virginia as soon as practicable after the close of each month 348 during which the net revenue was received into the state treasury. The distribution of the localities' share 349 of such net revenue shall be computed with respect to the net revenue received into the state treasury 350 during each month, and such distribution shall be made as soon as practicable after the close of each 351 such month.

352 D. The net revenue so distributable among the counties and cities shall be apportioned and 353 distributed upon the basis of the latest yearly estimate of the population of cities and counties ages five 354 to 19, provided by the Weldon Cooper Center for Public Service of the University of Virginia. Such population estimate produced by the Weldon Cooper Center for Public Service of the University of 355 356 Virginia shall account for persons who are domiciled in orphanages or charitable institutions or who are 357 dependents living on any federal military or naval reservation or other federal property within the school 358 division in which the institutions or federal military or naval reservation or other federal property is 359 located. Such population estimate produced by the Weldon Cooper Center for Public Service of the 360 University of Virginia shall account for members of the military services who are under 20 years of age within the school division in which the parents or guardians of such persons legally reside. Such 361 population estimate produced by the Weldon Cooper Center for Public Service of the University of 362 363 Virginia shall account for individuals receiving services in state hospitals, state training centers, or 364 mental health facilities, persons who are confined in state or federal correctional institutions, or persons who attend the Virginia School for the Deaf and the Blind within the school division in which the 365 parents or guardians of such persons legally reside. Such population estimate produced by the Weldon 366 367 Cooper Center for Public Service of the University of Virginia shall account for persons who attend

368 institutions of higher education within the school division in which the student's parents or guardians 369 legally reside. To such estimate, the Department of Education shall add the population of students with 370 disabilities, ages two through four and 20 through 21, as provided to the Department of Education by 371 school divisions. The revenue so apportionable and distributable is hereby appropriated to the several 372 counties and cities for maintenance, operation, capital outlays, debt and interest payments, or other 373 expenses incurred in the operation of the public schools, which shall be considered as funds raised from 374 local resources. In any county, however, wherein is situated any incorporated town constituting a school 375 division, the county treasurer shall pay into the town treasury for maintenance, operation, capital outlays, 376 debt and interest payments, or other expenses incurred in the operation of the public schools, the proper proportionate amount received by him in the ratio that the school population of such town bears to the 377 378 school population of the entire county. If the school population of any city or of any town constituting a 379 school division is increased by the annexation of territory since the last estimate of school population 380 provided by the Weldon Cooper Center for Public Service, such increase shall, for the purposes of this 381 section, be added to the school population of such city or town as shown by the last such estimate and a 382 proper reduction made in the school population of the county or counties from which the annexed 383 territory was acquired.

384 E. Beginning July 1, 2000, of the remaining sales and use tax revenue, the revenue generated by a 385 two percent sales and use tax, up to an annual amount of \$13 million, collected from the sales of 386 hunting equipment, auxiliary hunting equipment, fishing equipment, auxiliary fishing equipment, 387 wildlife-watching equipment, and auxiliary wildlife-watching equipment in Virginia, as estimated by the 388 most recent U.S. Department of the Interior, Fish and Wildlife Service and U.S. Department of 389 Commerce, Bureau of the Census National Survey of Fishing, Hunting, and Wildlife-Associated 390 Recreation, shall be paid into the Game Protection Fund established under § 29.1-101 and shall be used, 391 in part, to defray the cost of law enforcement. Not later than 30 days after the close of each quarter, the 392 Comptroller shall transfer to the Game Protection Fund the appropriate amount of collections to be 393 dedicated to such Fund. At any time that the balance in the Capital Improvement Fund, established 394 under § 29.1-101.01, is equal to or in excess of \$35 million, any portion of sales and use tax revenues 395 that would have been transferred to the Game Protection Fund, established under § 29.1-101, in excess 396 of the net operating expenses of the Board, after deduction of other amounts which accrue to the Board 397 and are set aside for the Game Protection Fund, shall remain in the general fund until such time as the 398 balance in the Capital Improvement Fund is less than \$35 million.

399 F. 1. Of the net revenue generated from the one-half percent increase in the rate of the state sales 400 and use tax effective August 1, 2004, pursuant to enactments of the 2004 Special Session I of the 401 General Assembly, the Comptroller shall transfer from the general fund of the state treasury to the 402 Public Education Standards of Quality/Local Real Estate Property Tax Relief Fund established under 403 § 58.1-638.1 an amount equivalent to one-half of the net revenue generated from such one-half percent increase as provided in this subdivision. The transfers to the Public Education Standards of 404 Quality/Local Real Estate Property Tax Relief Fund under this subdivision shall be for one-half of the 405 net revenue generated (and collected in the succeeding month) from such one-half percent increase for 406 407 the month of August 2004 and for each month thereafter.

408 2. Beginning July 1, 2013, of the remaining sales and use tax revenue, an amount equal to the
409 revenue generated by a 0.125 percent sales and use tax shall be distributed to the Public Education
410 Standards of Quality/Local Real Estate Property Tax Relief Fund established under § 58.1-638.1, and be
411 used for the state's share of Standards of Quality basic aid payments.

412 3. For the purposes of the Comptroller making the required transfers under subdivision 1 and 2, the 413 Tax Commissioner shall make a written certification to the Comptroller no later than the twenty-fifth of 414 each month certifying the sales and use tax revenues generated in the preceding month. Within three 415 calendar days of receiving such certification, the Comptroller shall make the required transfers to the 416 Public Education Standards of Quality/Local Real Estate Property Tax Relief Fund.

417 G. (Contingent expiration date) Beginning July 1, 2020, of the remaining sales and use tax revenue,
418 an amount equal to 20 percent of the revenue generated by a one-half percent sales and use tax, such as
419 that paid to the Commonwealth Transportation Fund as provided in subsection A, shall be paid to the
420 Commonwealth Transportation Fund established pursuant to § 33.2-1524.

The Commonwealth Transportation Fund's share of the net revenue distributable under this subsection

425 H. 1. Beginning July 1, 2022, of the remaining sales and use tax revenue, an amount equal to

427 supplemental school payment and credited to the account of each city and county based on the
428 distribution set forth in subdivision H 2 and according to the procedures of subsection C.

The additional revenue generated by increases in the state sales 438 439 and use tax from Planning District 8 pursuant to §§ 58.1-603.1, 58.1-604.01, 58.1-604.1, and 58.1-614

440 shall be deposited by the Comptroller in the fund established under § 33.2-2509.

441 2. The additional revenue generated by increases in the state sales and use tax from Planning District 23 pursuant to §§ 58.1-603.1, 58.1-604.01, 58.1-604.1, and 58.1-614 shall be deposited by the 442 443 Comptroller in the fund established under § 33.2-2600.

444 3. (For contingent expiration date, see Acts 2020, c. 1235) The additional revenue generated by 445 increases in the state sales and use tax from Planning District 15 pursuant to §§ 58.1-603.1, 58.1-604.01, 446 58.1-604.1, and 58.1-614 shall be deposited by the Comptroller in the fund established under 447 § 33.2-3701.

448 4. The additional revenue generated by increases in the state sales and use tax in any other Planning 449 District pursuant to §§ 58.1-603.1, 58.1-604.01, 58.1-604.1, and 58.1-614 shall be deposited into special 450 funds that shall be established by appropriate legislation.

451 5. The net revenues distributable under this subsection shall be computed as an estimate of the net 452 revenue to be received by the state treasury each month, and such estimated payment shall be adjusted 453 for the actual net revenue received in the preceding month. All payments shall be made to the 454 appropriate funds on the last day of each month.

455 I. J. (For contingent expiration date, see Acts 2018, c. 850) The additional revenue generated by 456 increases in the state sales and use tax from the Historic Triangle pursuant to § 58.1-603.2 shall be deposited by the Comptroller as follows: (i) 50 percent shall be deposited into the Historic Triangle 457 Marketing Fund established pursuant to subsection E of § 58.1-603.2; and (ii) 50 percent shall be 458 459 deposited in the special fund created pursuant to subdivision D 2 of § 58.1-603.2 and distributed to the 460 localities in which the revenues were collected. K. L. If errors are made in any distribution, or adjustments are otherwise necessary, the errors shall 467 468 be corrected and adjustments made in the distribution for the next quarter or for subsequent quarters.
