That § 18.2-251.03 of the Code of Virginia is amended and reenacted as follows: 10 § 18.2-251.03. Arrest and prosecution when experiencing or reporting overdoses. 11 A. For purposes of this section, "overdose" means a life-threatening condition resulting from the 12 13 consumption or use of a controlled substance, alcohol, or any combination of such substances. 14 B. No individual shall be subject to arrest or, prosecution, [or] show cause [- probation revocation, 15 or parole violation] for the unlawful purchase, possession, or consumption of alcohol pursuant to 16 § 4.1-305, unlawful purchase, possession, or consumption of marijuana pursuant to § 4.1-1105.1, possession of a controlled substance pursuant to § 18.2-250, intoxication in public pursuant to 17 § 18.2-388, or possession of controlled paraphernalia pursuant to § 54.1-3466 if: 18 19 1. Such individual (i) in good faith, seeks or obtains emergency medical attention (a) for himself, if 20 he is experiencing an overdose, or (b) for another individual, if such other individual is experiencing an 21 overdose; (ii) is experiencing an overdose and another individual, in good faith, seeks or obtains 22 emergency medical attention for such individual, by contemporaneously reporting such overdose to a 23 firefighter, as defined in § 65.2-102, emergency medical services personnel, as defined in § 32.1-111.1, a 24 law-enforcement officer, as defined in § 9.1-101, or an emergency 911 system; or (iii) in good faith, 25 renders emergency care or assistance, including cardiopulmonary resuscitation (CPR) or the administration of naloxone or other opioid antagonist for overdose reversal, to an individual experiencing 26 27 an overdose while another individual seeks or obtains emergency medical attention in accordance with 28 this subdivision: 29 2. Such individual remains at the scene of the overdose or at any alternative location to which he or 30 the person requiring emergency medical attention has been transported until a law-enforcement officer responds to the report of an overdose. If no law-enforcement officer is present at the scene of the 31 32 overdose or at the alternative location, then such individual shall cooperate with law enforcement as 33 otherwise set forth herein; 34 3. Such individual identifies himself to the law-enforcement officer who responds to the report of the 35 overdose: and 36 4. The evidence for the prosecution of an offense enumerated in this subsection was obtained as a 37 result of the individual seeking or obtaining emergency medical attention or rendering emergency care or 38 assistance. 39 C. The provisions of this section shall not apply to any person who seeks or obtains emergency 40 medical attention for himself or another individual, to a person experiencing an overdose when another individual seeks or obtains emergency medical attention for him, or to a person who renders emergency 41 42 care or assistance to an individual experiencing an overdose while another person seeks or obtains emergency medical attention during the execution of a search warrant or during the conduct of a lawful 43 44 search or a lawful arrest. 45 D. This section does not establish protection from arrest or prosecution for any individual or offense 46 other than those listed in subsection B. E. No law-enforcement officer acting in good faith shall be found liable for false arrest if it is later 47 determined that the person arrested was immune from prosecution under this section. 48

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
