9	Be it enacted by the General Assembly of Virginia:
10	1. That the Code of Virginia is amended by adding a section numbered 18.2-473.2 as follows:
11	§ 18.2-473.2. Covering a security camera in a correctional facility; penalty.
12	A. As used in this section, "security camera" means an analog or digital photographic or video
13	camera or other device capable of recording or transmitting a photograph, motion picture, or other
14	digital image that has been installed in a state or local correctional facility or any juvenile correctional
15	center.
16	B. Any person, other than a law-enforcement officer as defined in § 9.1-101, jail officer as defined in
17	§ 53.1-1, correctional officer as defined in § 53.1-1, or other custodial officer in charge of the
18	incarcerated persons or in charge of the persons committed to the Department of Juvenile Justice, who
19	intentionally covers, removes, damages, renders inoperable, or otherwise obscures a security camera
20	without the permission of the sheriff, jail superintendent, warden, or Director of the Department of
21	Corrections or Department of Juvenile Justice is guilty of a Class 1 misdemeanor.
22	C. Any person who intentionally covers, removes, damages, renders inoperable, or otherwise
23	obscures a security camera with the intent of inhibiting or preventing a security camera from recording
24	or transmitting a photograph, motion picture, or other digital image of the commission of a felony is
25	guilty of a Class 6 felony.
26	2. That the provisions of this act may result in a net increase in periods of imprisonment or
27	commitment. Pursuant to § 30-19.1:4 of the Code of Virginia, the estimated amount of the
28	necessary appropriation cannot be determined for periods of imprisonment in state adult
29	correctional facilities; therefore, Chapter 552 of the Acts of Assembly of 2021, Special Session I,
30	requires the Virginia Criminal Sentencing Commission to assign a minimum fiscal impact of
31	\$50,000. Pursuant to § 30-19.1:4 of the Code of Virginia, the estimated amount of the necessary
32	appropriation cannot be determined for periods of commitment to the custody of the Department
33	of Juvenile Justice.
