**4. Title:** Issuing citations; certain traffic offenses, exclusion of evidence.

**5. Summary:** Removes provisions providing that law enforcement officers may not lawfully stop (i) a motorcycle, moped, or motorized skateboard or scooter for a noise violation, (ii) a vehicle for an expired vehicle registration, (iii) a vehicle for defective equipment, (iv) a vehicle for tail or brake light violations, (v) a vehicle for an exhaust system violation, (vi) a vehicle for a window tinting violation, (vii) a vehicle with suspended objects that obstruct the driver's view, or (ix) a vehicle for having an expired vehicle inspection.
