- **3.** Committee: Commerce and Energy
- 4. Title: Public employees; bargaining representative certification.
- **5. Summary:** Provides that, in a locality that has authorized collective bargaining by ordinance or resolution, a bargaining representative must be selected for each collective bargaining unit determined to be appropriate by the governing body of the locality. The bill provides that for a bargaining representative to be certified as an exclusive representative, at least 51 percent of the public employees in a collective bargaining unit must vote for certification of the bargaining representative through a secret ballot election conducted by the governing body of the locality. Preexisting bargaining representatives must also be certified by a vote of 51 percent of the affected collective bargaining unit. The provisions of this bill do not apply to collective bargaining agreements entered into or modified until July 1st, 2022.

- **8. Fiscal Implications:** The provisions in this bill pertain to localities that have enacted collective bargaining resolutions. Therefore, there is no fiscal impact at the state level.
