Estimate of Local Fiscal Impact

In accordance with the provisions of §30-19.03 of the Code of Virginia, the staff of the Commission on Local Government offers the following analysis of the above-referenced legislation:

Bill Summary:

Jury duty; allowance increase. Increases the jury duty allowance from \$30 to \$40 for each day of attendance upon the court effective July 1, 2022; to \$45 effective July 1, 2023; and to \$50 effective July 1, 2024, and thereafter.

Executive Summary:

Localities have evaluated a negative fiscal impact ranging from \$0 - \$0.03 million.

Most of the responding localities reported a fiscal impact of \$0, as they expected the state to assume the costs of increasing juror compensation, or their locality was not responsible for paying jurors (e.g., towns).

For the localities which did report a negative fiscal impact, the cost stems from increases in compensation to jurors. These costs would come primarily from orientation days (where all potential jurors are required to report); the amount of compensation would then depend upon the term thereafter.

Local Analysis:

Locality: City of Danville Estimated Fiscal Impact: \$34,000.00

Currently, Danville courts are pulling 200 people per each term of Court ($200 \times 6 = 1,200$). We have an additional 200 people in the annual pool that we can use if we need to summon additional jurors. If additional jurors are needed, this gives us an annual pool of 1,400 total. Based on these numbers, at \$30 per day, we can expect the cost for orientation days (where all are required to report) to be between \$36,000 and \$42,000.

The increases proposed would make required orientation cost the following amounts: \$40 would cost between \$48,000-\$56,000, to \$45 would cost \$54,000-\$63,000, and to \$50 would cost \$60,000-\$70,000. Using the higher end estimates, the increase would be about \$34,000.

Please note: Costs will vary for the duration of the term after orientation day because all jurors may not report as scheduled. One term may have multiple jury trial dates that occur as scheduled, only for the next term to have every case be resolved prior to the date of the trial. The figures represented here represent the cost for every possible person called to jury duty to attend orientation.

Any increase in revenue from the legislation will benefit the State when assessed costs are paid by defendants.
