Any state impact would depend on the number of state employees that would object to actions advancing regulations, rules, policies, or other actions or purposes of government violating their believes, values or conscience in the course of their duties and how such objections would impact state agency operations. Agencies may need to reassign or cover duties objected to by hiring additional staff or providing overtime pay or compensatory time for other employees. Agencies, including the Office of the Attorney General and Department of Law, may also be impacted by disputes and claims brought by employees over state employer decisions related to the bill's provisions; however, any such impact is indeterminate.
