- **8. Fiscal Implications:** The language of the proposed bill appropriates \$2,603,263.89 from the general fund to be paid by the State Treasurer for the relief of Mr. Emerson Eugene Stevens. This bill also provides that Mr. Stevens may receive career and technical training from the Virginia Community College System reimbursed up to a maximum of \$10,000. Item 277 of HB30, as introduced, appropriates \$2,502,900 for the relief of Mr. Stevens. A budget amendment is required to align the funding provided in the budget bill with the funding provided in this relief bill
