2. Patron: Carr

3. Committee: Passed both houses.

4. Title: Exhaust systems; excessive noise.

5. Summary: Removes a current provision providing that no law enforcement officer shall stop a motor vehicle for violating § 46.2-1049, which requires exhaust systems to be in good working order, and that no evidence discovered or obtained in connection with such a stop be admissible in court. The bill also provides that the governing body of any county, city, or town may, by ordinance, regulate noise from vehicles that are operated on a highway that is not equipped with a muffler and exhaust system that conforms to the relevant Code sections. The bill also repeals § 15.2-919, concerning the regulation of noise from motorcycles, moped, or motorized skateboards or scooters.
