5.	not be require	<b>Summary:</b> Provides that a petitioner for a writ of vacatur for victims of sex trafficking shall not be required to pay any fees or costs for filing such petition if the petitioner is found to be unable to pay them pursuant to § 17.1-606.

8.	<b>Fiscal Implications:</b> Current law requires the clerk of the court to refund costs paid by a petitioner if the circuit court enters a writ of vacatur for the petitioner. The proposed legislation would expand this provision to excuse a petitioner from paying fees or costs for filing a petition if the Court determines that the petitioner is unable to pay these costs pursuant to § 17.1-606, regardless of whether the circuit court enters a writ of vacatur for the petitioner or not. Based on data from the Office of the Executive Secretary, Supreme Court of Virginia, fees range from about \$82 to \$91 per petition and vary by locality. Any potential fiscal impact on the Courts is indeterminate at this time. This impact statement will be updated when information becomes available.
