Summary: The proposed legislation removes a provision requiring the Department of Criminal Justice Services (DCJS) to establish training standards and publish and periodically update model policies for law enforcement personnel related to (a) the handling and use of tear gas or other gases and kinetic impact munitions that embody current best practices for using such items as a crowd control measure or during an arrest or detention of a person. It also removes a requirement that DCJS establish and administer a waiver process for law enforcement agencies to use certain military property and to publish waivers that have been granted on the DCJS website. The bill also repeals provisions prohibiting state and local law enforcement agencies
