Summary:** The enrolled bill requires the Department of Medical Assistance Services to continue the work group composed of individuals with developmental disabilities, families of individuals with developmental disabilities, representatives of advocacy organizations, and other appropriate stakeholders to study and develop recommendations for the permanent use of virtual supports and increasing access to virtual supports and services for individuals with intellectual and developmental disabilities by promoting access to assistive technology and environmental modifications. The department must report its findings and recommendations to the Governor and the General Assembly by November 1, 2022.
