2. Patron: Deeds

3. Committee: Passed Both Houses

4. Title: Providers of treatment for opioid addiction; conditions for initial licensure; location.

5. Summary: Eliminates the restriction that providers of treatment for persons with opiate addiction may not be located within one-half mile of a public or private licensed day care center or a public or private K-12 school. Current law permits certain limited exceptions to this restriction. The enrolled bill delays the effective date of this legislation to January 1, 2023.

6. Budget Amendment Necessary: No.

7. Fiscal Impact Estimates: No fiscal impact.

8. Fiscal Implications: There is no fiscal impact resulting from the elimination of the distance requirement. The cost of building or moving facilities is borne by the providers.
