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lÓ	Be it enacted by the General Assembly of Virginia:
11	1. That § 18.2-311.1 of the Code of Virginia is amended and reenacted as follows:
12	§ 18.2-311.1. Removing, altering, etc., serial number or other identification on firearm;
13 14	distributing or possessing firearm without serial number.
14	Any A. It is unlawful for any person, firm, association, or corporation who or which to intentionally
15	removes, defaces, alters, changes, destroys or obliterates remove, deface, alter, change, destroy, or
16	obliterate in any manner or way or who or which causes to cause to be removed, defaced, altered,
17	changed, destroyed, or obliterated in any manner or way the name of the maker, model, manufacturer's
18 19	or serial number, or any other mark or identification on any pistol, shotgun, rifle, machine gun, or any other firearm shall be guilty of. A violation of this subsection is a Class 1 misdemeanor.
20	B. It is unlawful for any person, firm, association, or corporation to knowingly possess any pistol,
21	shotgun, rifle, machine gun, or any other firearm that has a serial number that has been removed,
22	defaced, altered, changed, destroyed, or obliterated in any manner. A violation of this subsection is a
22 23	Class 1 misdemeanor.
24	C. It is unlawful for any person, firm, association, or corporation to sell, give, or distribute any
25	pistol, shotgun, rifle, machine gun, or any other firearm that has a serial number that has been
26	removed, defaced, altered, changed, destroyed, or obliterated in any manner. A violation of this
27	subsection is a Class 1 misdemeanor.
28 29	2. That the provisions of this act may result in a net increase in periods of imprisonment or commitment. Pursuant to § 30-19.1:4 of the Code of Virginia, the estimated amount of the
29 30	necessary appropriation is \$0 for periods of imprisonment in state adult correctional facilities and

commutation. Fursuant to § 50-19.1:4 of the Code of Virginia, the estimated amount of the
necessary appropriation is \$0 for periods of imprisonment in state adult correctional facilities and
cannot be determined for periods of commitment to the custody of the Department of Juvenile
Justice.

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
