That § 65.2-402 of the Code of Virginia is amended and reenacted as follows: § 65.2-402. Presumption as to death or disability from respiratory disease, hypertension or 11 12 heart disease, cancer. A. Respiratory diseases that cause (i) the death of volunteer or salaried firefighters or Department of 13 14 Emergency Management hazardous materials officers or (ii) any health condition or impairment of such 15 firefighters or Department of Emergency Management hazardous materials officers resulting in total or 16 partial disability shall be presumed to be occupational diseases, suffered in the line of duty, that are covered by this title unless such presumption is overcome by a preponderance of competent evidence to 17 18 the contrary. 19 B. Hypertension or heart disease causing the death of, or any health condition or impairment 20 resulting in total or partial disability of any of the following persons who have completed five years of 21 service in their position as (i) salaried or volunteer firefighters, (ii) members of the State Police Officers' 22 Retirement System, (iii) members of county, city or town police departments, (iv) sheriffs and deputy 23 sheriffs, (v) Department of Emergency Management hazardous materials officers, (vi) city sergeants or deputy city sergeants of the City of Richmond, (vii) Virginia Marine Police officers, (viii) conservation 24 25 police officers who are full-time sworn members of the enforcement division of the Department of Wildlife Resources, (ix) Capitol Police officers, (x) special agents of the Virginia Alcoholic Beverage 26 Control Authority appointed under the provisions of Chapter 1 (§ 4.1-100 et seq.) of Title 4.1, (xi) for 27 28 such period that the Metropolitan Washington Airports Authority voluntarily subjects itself to the 29 provisions of this chapter as provided in § 65.2-305, officers of the police force established and 30 maintained by the Metropolitan Washington Airports Authority, (xii) officers of the police force 31 established and maintained by the Norfolk Airport Authority, (xiii) sworn officers of the police force established and maintained by the Virginia Port Authority, (xiv) campus police officers appointed under 32 Article 3 (§ 23.1-809 et seq.) of Chapter 8 of Title 23.1 and employed by any public institution of 33 34 higher education, and (xv) salaried or volunteer emergency medical services personnel, as defined in 35 § 32.1-111.1, when such emergency medical services personnel is operating in a locality that has legally 36 adopted a resolution declaring that it will provide one or more of the presumptions under this 37 subsection, shall be presumed to be occupational diseases, suffered in the line of duty, that are covered 38 by this title unless such presumption is overcome by a preponderance of competent evidence to the 39 contrary. 40 C. Leukemia or pancreatic, prostate, rectal, throat, ovarian, breast, colon, brain, or testicular cancer causing the death of, or any health condition or impairment resulting in total or partial disability of, any 41 42 volunteer or salaried firefighter, any of the following persons who have completed five years of service in their position as (i) salaried or volunteer firefighters; (ii) Department of Emergency Management 43 hazardous materials officers, officers; (iii) commercial vehicle enforcement officer officers or motor 44 45 carrier safety trooper troopers employed by the Department of State Police, σ ; (iv) arson investigators 46 or bomb investigators employed by the Department of State Police; (v) full-time sworn member 47 members of the enforcement division of the Department of Motor Vehicles having completed five years of service; or (vi) [personnel employed by the Commonwealth or any of its agencies to members of the 48 49 State Police Officers' Retirement System who] collect, analyze, or handle hazardous materials, [hazardous chemicals, radiological materials, biological agents, or drugs as defined in § 44-146.34, 50 51 infectious biological substances and radiological agents, as defined in § 18.2-52.1, fentanyl or fentanyl 52 analogs, or methamphetamine, its salts, isomers, or salts of its isomers] shall be presumed to be an 53 occupational disease, suffered in the line of duty, that is covered by this title, unless such presumption is 54 overcome by a preponderance of competent evidence to the contrary. For colon, brain, or testicular 55 cancer, the presumption shall not apply for any individual who was diagnosed with such a condition before July 1, 2020. 56

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57 D. The presumptions described in subsections A, B, and C shall only apply if persons entitled to 58 invoke them have, if requested by the private employer, appointing authority or governing body

employing them, undergone preemployment physical examinations that (i) were conducted prior to the 59

making of any claims under this title that rely on such presumptions, (ii) were performed by physicians 60 whose qualifications are as prescribed by the private employer, appointing authority or governing body 61

62 employing such persons, (iii) included such appropriate laboratory and other diagnostic studies as the

63 private employer, appointing authorities or governing bodies may have prescribed, and (iv) found such

64 persons free of respiratory diseases, hypertension, cancer or heart disease at the time of such 65 examinations.

66 E. Persons making claims under this title who rely on such presumptions shall, upon the request of private employers, appointing authorities or governing bodies employing such persons, submit to 67 physical examinations (i) conducted by physicians selected by such employers, authorities, bodies or 68 their representatives and (ii) consisting of such tests and studies as may reasonably be required by such 69 70 physicians. However, a qualified physician, selected and compensated by the claimant, may, at the 71 election of such claimant, be present at such examination.

F. Whenever a claim for death benefits is made under this title and the presumptions of this section 72 73 are invoked, any person entitled to make such claim shall, upon the request of the appropriate private employer, appointing authority or governing body that had employed the deceased, submit the body of 74 75 the deceased to a postmortem examination as may be directed by the Commission. A qualified physician, selected and compensated by the person entitled to make the claim, may, at the election of 76 77 such claimant, be present at such postmortem examination.

78 G. Volunteer law-enforcement chaplains, auxiliary and reserve deputy sheriffs, and auxiliary and 79 reserve police are not included within the coverage of this section.

80 H. For purposes of this section, "firefighter" includes special forest wardens designated pursuant to § 10.1-1135 and any persons who are employed by or contract with private employers primarily to 81 82

perform firefighting services.
