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VIRGINIA ACTS OF ASSEMBLY - CHAPTER

2 An Act to amend and reenact §§ 18.2-308.02 and 18.2-308.06 of the Code of Virginia, relating to 3 concealed handgun permit; demonstrated competence.

6 Be it enacted by the General Assembly of Virginia:

1. That §§ 18.2-308.02 and 18.2-308.06 of the Code of Virginia are amended and reenacted as 7 8 follows:

Approved

§ 18.2-308.02. Application for a concealed handgun permit; Virginia resident or domiciliary.

10 A. Any person 21 years of age or older may apply in writing to the clerk of the circuit court of the county or city in which he resides, or if he is a member of the United States Armed Forces and 11 12 stationed outside the Commonwealth, the county or city in which he is domiciled, for a five-year permit to carry a concealed handgun. There shall be no requirement regarding the length of time an applicant 13 has been a resident or domiciliary of the county or city. The application shall be on a form prescribed 14 by the Department of State Police, in consultation with the Supreme Court, requiring only that 15 information necessary to determine eligibility for the permit. Additionally, the application shall request 16 but not require that the applicant provide an email or other electronic address where a notice of permit 17 expiration can be sent pursuant to subsection C of § 18.2-308.010. The applicant shall present one valid 18 19 form of photo identification issued by a governmental agency of the Commonwealth or by the U.S. Department of Defense or U.S. State Department (passport). No information or documentation other than 20 21 that which is allowed on the application in accordance with this section may be requested or required by 22 the clerk or the court.

23 B. The court shall require proof that the applicant has demonstrated competence with a handgun in 24 person and the applicant may demonstrate such competence by one of the following, but no applicant 25 shall be required to submit to any additional demonstration of competence, nor shall any proof of 26 demonstrated competence expire:

27 1. Completing any hunter education or hunter safety course approved by the Department of Wildlife 28 Resources or a similar agency of another state;

29 2. Completing any National Rifle Association or United States Concealed Carry Association firearms 30 safety or training course;

31 3. Completing any firearms safety or training course or class available to the general public offered 32 by a law-enforcement agency, institution of higher education, or private or public institution or 33 organization or firearms training school utilizing instructors certified by the National Rifle Association, 34 the United States Concealed Carry Association, or the Department of Criminal Justice Services;

35 4. Completing any law-enforcement firearms safety or training course or class offered for security 36 guards, investigators, special deputies, or any division or subdivision of law enforcement or security 37 enforcement;

38 5. Presenting evidence of equivalent experience with a firearm through participation in organized 39 shooting competition or current military service or proof of an honorable discharge from any branch of 40 the armed services;

41 6. Obtaining or previously having held a license to carry a firearm in the Commonwealth or a 42 locality thereof, unless such license has been revoked for cause;

43 7. Completing any in-person firearms training or safety course or class conducted by a state-certified 44 or, National Rifle Association-certified, or United States Concealed Carry Association-certified firearms 45 instructor;

46 8. Completing any governmental police agency firearms training course and qualifying to carry a firearm in the course of normal police duties; or 47 **48**

9. Completing any other firearms training that the court deems adequate.

49 A photocopy of a certificate of completion of any of the courses or classes; an affidavit from the 50 instructor, school, club, organization, or group that conducted or taught such course or class attesting to the completion of the course or class by the applicant; or a copy of any document that shows 51 completion of the course or class or evidences participation in firearms competition shall constitute 52 53 evidence of qualification under this subsection.

54 C. The making of a materially false statement in an application under this article shall constitute 55 perjury, punishable as provided in § 18.2-434.

56 D. The clerk of court shall withhold from public disclosure the applicant's name and any other HB1422ER

information contained in a permit application or any order issuing a concealed handgun permit, except 57 58 that such information shall not be withheld from any law-enforcement officer acting in the performance 59 of his official duties or from the applicant with respect to his own information. The prohibition on 60 public disclosure of information under this subsection shall not apply to any reference to the issuance of 61 a concealed handgun permit in any order book before July 1, 2008; however, any other concealed 62 handgun records maintained by the clerk shall be withheld from public disclosure.

E. An application is deemed complete when all information required to be furnished by the applicant, 63 64 including the fee for a concealed handgun permit as set forth in § 18.2-308.03, is delivered to and 65 received by the clerk of court before or concomitant with the conduct of a state or national criminal 66 history records check.

67 F. For purposes of this section, a member of the United States Armed Forces is domiciled in the 68 county or city where such member claims his home of record with the United States Armed Forces. 69

§ 18.2-308.06. Nonresident concealed handgun permits.

70 A. Nonresidents of the Commonwealth 21 years of age or older may apply in writing to the Virginia 71 Department of State Police for a five-year permit to carry a concealed handgun. The applicant shall submit a photocopy of one valid form of photo identification issued by a governmental agency of the applicant's state of residency or by the U.S. Department of Defense or U.S. State Department (passport). 72 73 74 Every applicant for a nonresident concealed handgun permit shall also submit two photographs of a type 75 and kind specified by the Department of State Police for inclusion on the permit and shall submit 76 fingerprints on a card provided by the Department of State Police for the purpose of obtaining the 77 applicant's state or national criminal history record. As a condition for issuance of a concealed handgun 78 permit, the applicant shall submit to fingerprinting by his local or state law-enforcement agency and 79 provide personal descriptive information to be forwarded with the fingerprints through the Central Criminal Records Exchange to the U.S. Federal Bureau of Investigation for the purpose of obtaining 80 criminal history record information regarding the applicant and obtaining fingerprint identification 81 information from federal records pursuant to criminal investigations by state and local law-enforcement 82 agencies. The application shall be on a form provided by the Department of State Police, requiring only 83 that information necessary to determine eligibility for the permit. If the permittee is later found by the 84 85 Department of State Police to be disqualified, the permit shall be revoked and the person shall return the permit after being so notified by the Department of State Police. The permit requirement and restriction 86 provisions of subsection C of § 18.2-308.02 and § 18.2-308.09 shall apply, mutatis mutandis, to the 87 88 provisions of this subsection. 89

B. The applicant shall demonstrate competence with a handgun in person by one of the following:

90 1. Completing a hunter education or hunter safety course approved by the Virginia Department of 91 Wildlife Resources or a similar agency of another state;

92 2. Completing any National Rifle Association or United States Concealed Carry Association firearms 93 safety or training course;

94 3. Completing any firearms safety or training course or class available to the general public offered by a law-enforcement agency, institution of higher education, or private or public institution or 95 96 organization or firearms training school utilizing instructors certified by the National Rifle Association, 97 the United States Concealed Carry Association, or the Department of Criminal Justice Services or a 98 similar agency of another state;

99 4. Completing any law-enforcement firearms safety or training course or class offered for security 100 guards, investigators, special deputies, or any division or subdivision of law enforcement or security 101 enforcement;

102 5. Presenting evidence of equivalent experience with a firearm through participation in organized shooting competition approved by the Department of State Police or current military service or proof of 103 104 an honorable discharge from any branch of the armed services;

105 6. Obtaining or previously having held a license to carry a firearm in the Commonwealth or a 106 locality thereof, unless such license has been revoked for cause;

107 7. Completing any in-person firearms training or safety course or class conducted by a state-certified 108 or, National Rifle Association-certified, or United States Concealed Carry Association-certified firearms 109 instructor;

110 8. Completing any governmental police agency firearms training course and qualifying to carry a 111 firearm in the course of normal police duties; or

9. Completing any other firearms training that the Virginia Department of State Police deems 112 113 adequate.

114 A photocopy of a certificate of completion of any such course or class; an affidavit from the instructor, school, club, organization, or group that conducted or taught such course or class attesting to 115 the completion of the course or class by the applicant; or a copy of any document that shows 116 completion of the course or class or evidences participation in firearms competition shall satisfy the 117

118 requirement for demonstration of competence with a handgun.

C. The Department of State Police may charge a fee not to exceed \$100 to cover the cost of the background check and issuance of the permit. Any fees collected shall be deposited in a special account to be used to offset the costs of administering the nonresident concealed handgun permit program.

D. The permit to carry a concealed handgun shall contain only the following information: name,
address, date of birth, gender, height, weight, color of hair, color of eyes, and photograph of the
permittee; the signature of the Superintendent of the Virginia Department of State Police or his designee;
the date of issuance; and the expiration date.

E. The Superintendent of the State Police shall promulgate regulations, pursuant to the Administrative
Process Act (§ 2.2-4000 et seq.), for the implementation of an application process for obtaining a
nonresident concealed handgun permit.
