4	Virginia Highway Corporation Act of 1988 should operate under the Public-Private Transportation

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10	Be it enacted by the General Assembly of Virginia:
11	1. § 1. The Commissioner of Highways (the Commissioner), in consultation with the Secretary of
12	Transportation and the Secretary of Finance, shall evaluate whether it is in the public interest for any
13	roadway within the Commonwealth operated pursuant to the Virginia Highway Corporation Act of 1988
14	(§ 56-535 et seq. of the Code of Virginia), hereinafter referred to as the HCA, to instead be operated as
15	a qualifying transportation facility under the authority and requirements provided by the Public-Private
16 17	Transportation Act of 1995 (§ 33.2-1800 et seq. of the Code of Virginia), hereinafter referred to as the
17	PPTA. Such evaluation of the public interest shall consider lower tolls, distanced-based pricing, and regional transportation benefits.
10 19	In the event that the Commissioner determines that it is in the public interest for any roadway in the
20	Commonwealth operated pursuant to the HCA to instead be operated under the authority and
2 1	requirements provided by the PPTA, and the Secretary of Transportation concurs, the Commissioner is
22	authorized to negotiate the key business terms of a comprehensive agreement with the applicable
23	roadway. Such key business terms may include (i) the applicable commercial and financial terms for the
24	Commonwealth; (ii) toll rate reductions for a full-length, end-to-end trip; (iii) the implementation of
25	distance-based tolling; (iv) benefits to commuters that use such roadway and to the regional
26	transportation network; and (v) any enhancements to such roadway. The Commissioner shall present
27	such key business terms to the Transportation Public-Private Steering Committee established pursuant to
28	§ 33.2-1803.2 of the Code of Virginia (the Committee) for its consideration. If the Committee concurs
29	that such operation under the authority and requirements of the PPTA is in the public interest, the
30	General Assembly hereby authorizes the Commissioner to finalize and execute a new comprehensive
31	agreement between the roadway operator and the Department of Transportation. Notwithstanding
32	§ 56-551 of the Code of Virginia, upon execution of such new comprehensive agreement, the
33	corresponding roadway shall immediately become subject to the PPTA. Upon the execution of the new
34	comprehensive agreement, the State Corporation Commission shall retain no further authority with
35 36	respect to such operation and shall transfer all of its records and regulatory oversight responsibilities
30 37	regarding such roadway to the Department of Transportation. In the absence of an executed new comprehensive agreement as authorized hereunder, the State
37 38	Corporation Commission shall continue to fulfill its regulatory responsibilities under the HCA. The

2. That the provisions of this act shall expire on January 1, 2025. The provisions of this enactment shall not be construed to require the expiration of a new comprehensive agreement executed pursuant to this act.
